1 A BILL for an Act to provide for a statewide water development program; to amend and reenact

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. Statewide water development program. The legislative assembly finds 7 that there is a critical need to develop a comprehensive statewide water development program. 8 The state water commission shall develop and implement a comprehensive statewide water 9 development program. The commission shall design the program to serve the long-term water 10 resource needs of the state and its people and to protect the state's current usage of, and the 11 state's claim to, its proper share of Missouri River water. 12 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 57-51.1-07 of the 1995 Supplement to the North 13 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 14 57-51.1-07. (Effective through June 30, 1997) Allocation of moneys in oil 15 extraction tax development fund. Moneys deposited in the oil extraction tax development 16 fund must be apportioned quarterly by the state treasurer as follows: 17 1. Twenty percent must be allocated and credited to the sinking fund established for 18 payment of the state of North Dakota water development bonds, southwest 19 pipeline series, and any moneys in excess of the sum necessary to maintain the 20 accounts within the sinking fund and for the payment of principal and interest on 21 the bonds, must be credited to a special trust fund, to be known as the resources 22 trust fund. The resources trust fund must be established in the state treasury and 23 the funds therein must be deposited and invested as are other state funds to earn 24 the maximum amount permitted by law which income must be deposited in the

1		resources trust fund. The principal and income of the resources trust fund may be	
2		expended only pursuant to legislative appropriation and are available to:	
3		a. The state water commission for planning for and construction of water-related	
4		projects, including rural water systems. These water-related projects must be	
5		those which the state water commission has the authority to undertake and	
6		construct pursuant to chapter 61-02; and	
7		b. The industrial commission for the funding of programs for development of	
8		energy conservation and renewable energy sources; for studies for	
9		development of cogeneration systems that increase the capacity of a system	
10		to produce more than one kind of energy from the same fuel; for studies for	
11		development of waste products utilization; and for the making of grants and	
12		loans in connection therewith.	
13	2.	Twenty percent must be allocated as provided in section 24 of article X of the	
14		Constitution of North Dakota.	
15	3.	Sixty percent must be allocated and credited to the state's general fund for general	
16		state purposes.	
17	(Eff	ective July 1, 1997) Allocation of moneys in oil extraction tax development

13	SECTI	ON 3. TRANSFER. During the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending	
14	June 30, 1999, the director of the office of management and budget shall transfer \$2,000,000		
15	from the state general fund to the resources trust fund.		
16	SECTI	ON 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 1997.	
17	SECTI	ON 5. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
