- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 26.1-36-08 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to group health policy and health service contract substance abuse

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 26.1-36-08 of the North Dakota
6 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 7 2. The benefits must be provided for inpatient treatment and treatment by partial
 8 hospitalization and outpatient treatment:
- 9 a. In the case of benefits provided for inpatient treatment, the benefits must be
 provided for a minimum of sixty days of services covered under this section
 and section 26.1-36-09 in any calendar year if provided by a hospital as
 defined in subsection 25 of section 52-01-01 and rules of the state
 department of health pursuant thereto, or as licensed under section
 23-17.1-01, offering treatment for the prevention or cure of alcoholism, drug
 addiction, or other related illness.
- 16b.In the case of benefits provided for partial hospitalization, the benefits must be17provided for a minimum of one hundred twenty days of services covered18under this section and section 26.1-36-09 in any calendar year if provided by19a hospital as defined in subsection 25 of section 52-01-01 and rules of the20state department of health pursuant thereto or as licensed under section2123-17.1-01, or by an addiction treatment program licensed under section2223-17.1-01, or by a regional human service center licensed under section
- 23 50-06-05.2, offering that offers treatment for the prevention or cure of
 - alcoholism, drug addiction, or other related illness. For services provided in

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1			regional human service centers, charges must be reasonably similar to the
2			charges for care provided by hospitals as defined in this subsection.
3	C	c.	Benefits may also be provided for a combination of inpatient and partial
4			hospitalization treatment. For the purpose of computing the period for which
5			benefits are payable, each day of inpatient treatment is equivalent to two days
6			of treatment by partial hospitalization; provided, however, that no more than
7			forty-six days of the inpatient treatment benefits required by this section may
8			be traded for treatment by partial hospitalization.
9	С	d.	In the case of benefits provided for outpatient treatment, the benefits must be
10			provided for a minimum of twenty visits for services covered under this section
11			in any calendar year, provided the diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment
12			services are provided within the scope of licensure by a licensed physician, a
13			licensed psychologist who is eligible for listing on the national register of
14			health service providers in psychology, or the treatment services are provided
15			within the scope of licensure by a licensed addiction counselor. The
16			insurance company, nonprofit health service corporation, or health
17			maintenance organization may not establish a deductible or a copayment for
18			the first five visits in any calendar year, and may not establish a copayment
19			greater than twenty percent for the remaining visits.
20	e	e.	If the services are provided by a provider outside a preferred provider network
21			without a referral from within the network, the insurance company, nonprofit
22			health service corporation, or health maintenance organization may establish
23			a copayment greater than twenty percent for only those visits after the first
24			five visits in any calendar year.
25	"	"Par	tial hospitalization" means continuous treatment for at least three hours, but
26	r	not r	nore than twelve hours, in any twenty-four-hour period and includes the
27	r	med	ically necessary treatment services provided by licensed professionals under
