"SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-07.2 of the 1995 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

20.1-03-07.2. Nonresident youth hunting licenses. A nonresident youth who is less than sixteen years of age may purchase a resident small game hunting license and may hunt small upland game and waterfowl except swans and wild turkeys; provided, that the nonresident youth's state, or province or territory of Canada, of residence provides a reciprocal licensing agreement for North Dakota residents who are less than sixteen years of age. To be eligible to purchase a license under this section, a nonresident youth may not have arrived at the age of sixteen before September first of the year for which the license is issued and must possess a certificate of completion for a certified hunter education course. The nonresident youth may only hunt under the supervision of an adult family member or legal guardian who is licensed to hunt small game or waterfowl and upland game in this state and is subject to the same regulations as that youth's adult family member or legal guardian. This section does not apply to the hunting of big game or to a license issued by lottery."
