- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-12-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to weight-restricted roads.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-12-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-12-03. Commissioner or local authorities may limit use of vehicles on highways. Whenever any If a highway will be seriously damaged or destroyed by reason of deterioration, rain, snow, or other climatic conditions unless the use of vehicles is prohibited or the weight of the vehicle thereon vehicles is limited, the commissioner director or employees authorized by him the director by an order, and local authorities by ordinance or resolution, may prohibit the operation of vehicles upon such the highway or may impose restrictions as to the weight of vehicles. The commissioner director or employees making such the order and local authorities enacting any such the ordinance or resolution shall erect or cause to be have erected and maintained signs designating the provisions of the order, ordinance, or resolution. Such The signs must be erected and maintained at each end of that the portion of any highway affected thereby by the order, ordinance, or resolution, and such the order, ordinance, or resolution is not effective until such the signs are erected and maintained. The operation of trucks or other commercial vehicles or weight limitations as to the weight thereof on trucks or other commercial vehicles on designated highways may be prohibited or limited in the same manner. On highways as they enter this state, the director shall place an additional sign above any sign designating weight limitations on trucks and other commercial vehicles. This additional sign must list the maximum axle weight in two hundred point type in black letters on an orange background.
