# ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2173

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-40.1-09, 15-40.1-09.1, 15-47-04, and

2 15-47-33 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the length of the school term.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-40.1-09 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **15-40.1-09.** Application for payments - Verification and determination of

7 payments for high school students - Report of county superintendent of schools -

8 **Appeal.** Immediately upon the completion of the registration of students at the beginning of 9 each school term and in no event later than September tenth of each year, the business 10 manager of each school district within or without this state which is claiming payments from 11 state funds under the provisions of this chapter shall file with the county superintendent of 12 schools a claim on a form prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction stating the 13 number of students registered in high school and elementary grades for which payments are 14 claimed, and such other information as may be reasonably requested by the superintendent of 15 public instruction. Not later than December first, the superintendent of public instruction shall 16 certify to the office of management and budget a list of the school districts and schools not 17 operated by school districts entitled to payments from state funds, together with the amounts to 18 which the several districts and schools are entitled. Per student aid as provided under sections 19 15-40.1-06, 15-40.1-07, and 15-40.1-08 must be computed on the basis of the previous year's 20 average daily membership less the number of students attending school during the current 21 school year in another district under the provisions of open enrollment or the current year's fall 22 enrollment, whichever provides the greatest payment, for all current grade levels. Adjustments 23 must be made in the subsequent year according to a comparison between the average daily 24 membership for the year for which the adjusted payment is being made and the year preceding

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1 the year for which the adjusted payment is being made, whichever is greater, for grade levels 2 that existed in both years. The greater of the two preceding years' average daily membership 3 must be used in computing any adjustment in a district's foundation aid payments. For 4 purposes of this chapter, "average daily membership" shall mean means the total days all 5 students in a given school are in attendance, including two days set aside for the North Dakota 6 education association convention, plus any instructional conference, three holidays selected 7 from those listed in subsections 2 through 10 of section 15-38-04.1 which have been decided 8 upon after selected by the school board in consultation with the teachers, the total days all 9 students are absent, and the up to two full days during which parent-teacher conference days 10 authorized in section 15-47-33 conferences are held or up to two full days as hour-for-hour 11 compensatory time if parent-teacher conferences are held outside normal school hours and the 12 total days all students are absent, divided by one hundred eighty days. School districts 13 educating children of agricultural migratory workers or offering high school summer school 14 programs during the months of June, July, and August shall not be restricted to payments for a 15 one hundred eighty-day school term.

16 Immediately upon the termination of the school term year, and in no event later than 17 July fifteenth of each year, the business manager of each school district within or without this 18 state which has received payments from state funds under the provisions of this chapter shall 19 file with the county superintendent of schools a verified statement of the name, residence, and 20 membership of elementary and high school students as provided for in this section, and 21 number of units of high school work taken by each high school student enrolled during the 22 previous school year. The statement shall be attested to by the county superintendent of 23 schools. The county superintendent shall investigate the validity of the statement and shall 24 determine the residence and other qualifications of each student named in the statement. The 25 county superintendent shall certify to the superintendent of public instruction on or before 26 September first of each year the number of enrolled students in each district in the county for 27 the previous school year upon which any adjustment may be based as provided in this section. 28 If any statement is disallowed in whole or in part, notice of the disallowance and the names of 29 students who are disallowed shall be reported to the superintendent of public instruction and to 30 the district filing the statement. Any district may appeal to the superintendent of public 31 instruction from the determination of the county superintendent of schools on or before

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September fifteenth in the year in which the determination is made. The superintendent of
 public instruction may change or modify the determination of the county superintendent if the
 evidence submitted by the district warrants a modification. The judgment of the superintendent
 of public instruction shall be final.

5 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-40.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
6 is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15-40.1-09.1. Emergency resulting from acts of God - Foundation program 8 **payment eligibility.** The existence of a state of emergency may be proclaimed by the 9 governor if he the governor finds that an act of God has occurred and that the safety and 10 welfare of the inhabitants of the state or of any portion thereof of the state require the closing of 11 schools or any particular school. Any such The emergency terminates upon the proclamation 12 of the termination thereof by the governor. Any school district which is located within the 13 boundaries of the territory included within the governor's proclamation of a state of emergency 14 or designated by it may include days actually lost, not to exceed five days, during which school 15 was not held because of such state of emergency for purposes of the foundation program as 16 provided in this chapter. Any school district in which schools are closed for in excess of five 17 days in any school year because of such a state of emergency shall receive two days of credit 18 for foundation program purposes for each additional day school is held to make up for such lost 19 days. Nothing in this section affects the length of the school year as provided for in section 20 15-47-33. 21 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-47-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows: 23 15-47-04. "School year", "month", and "week" defined. The school year must 24 begin on the first day of July and must close on the thirtieth day of June of the following year. A 25 school month consists of twenty days, and a school week consists of five days. 26 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15-47-33 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-47-33. Length of elementary and secondary school year term.

All elementary and secondary schools in this state shall provide for a school term
 <u>of</u> at least one hundred eighty days <del>of classroom instruction during each school</del>
 term. Any three <u>apportioned as follows:</u>

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1		<u>a.</u>	One hundred seventy-three full days of instruction;
2		<u>b.</u>	Three holidays selected from those listed in subsections 2 through 10 of
3			section 15-38-04.1 which have been decided upon after selected by the
4			school board in consultation with the district teachers, any two days, or
5			fractions of days not to exceed a total of two days, which are devoted to;
6		<u>C.</u>	Two days for the attendance of teachers at the North Dakota education
7			association instructional conference; and
8		<u>d.</u>	Up to two full days during which parent-teacher conferences and which are
9			selected by the local school board after consultation with the teachers, and
10			any day in which classes cannot be held because of acts of God, epidemic, or
11			failure of physical facilities must be included in the one hundred eighty days
12			provided for in this section and teachers must be paid therefor are held or up
13			to two full days as hour-for-hour compensatory time if parent-teacher
14			conferences are held outside of normal school hours.
15	<u>2.</u>	<u>A fu</u>	Ill day of instruction:
16		<u>a.</u>	Consists of at least five and one-half hours of instruction time for elementary
17			students;
18		<u>b.</u>	Consists of at least six hours of instruction time for high school students; and
19		<u>C.</u>	May conclude no earlier than 2:30 p.m.
