- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to custodial education before a divorce.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Divorce proceeding - Waiting period - Mandatory custodial education. In an action for divorce which involves the issue of child custody or visitation, the district court may not issue a final order for at least ninety days from the date of filing the petition. The ninety-day period may be waived by the court for good cause shown and without objection by either party. Within the ninety-day waiting period, the adult parties to the action shall participate in a court-approved course that addresses the effects of divorce on children. A final decree may not be granted or a final order may not be entered until the parties have participated in the course. A party who has a demonstrable history of domestic violence must be ordered to participate in a course provided either through a child visitation and custody exchange center, a community-based domestic violence agency, a regional human service center, or a parenting education program provided in conjunction with a community-based domestic violence program. The program must include education regarding domestic violence, its prevention, and its effect upon a child. The court may waive or delay participation in a course for good cause, including a default by any of the parties or the lack of an available course within a reasonable distance of the parties. Participation in the course is not required if the proceeding involves termination of parental rights of any of the parties.

**SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## 1 Custodial education course requirements - Fees - Exceptions - Rulemaking 2 authority. 3 1. Each judicial district shall certify approved custodial education courses for those 4 parties required to participate in this type of course. An approved course may be 5 provided by a public or private entity. The course, in order to be approved by the 6 court, must consist of at least four hours of instruction and, at a minimum, provide 7 instruction regarding the following issues: 8 Information on the developmental stages of a child; a. 9 Adjustment of a child to parental separation; b. 10 Dispute resolution and conflict management; C. 11 d. Guidelines for visitation; 12 e. Stress reduction in children; and 13 f. Cooperative parenting. 14 2. The court may not require both parents to attend the same course at the same 15 time. 16 3. Each party shall arrange for participation in the course. The parties are 17 responsible for the fees or costs of the course. The court may assess the fees or 18 costs as the court deems equitable. If the court determines that both parents are 19 indigent, the court may not impose the cost of the course on the parents. 20 4. Each party shall submit certification of completion of the course to the court before 21 the court grants a final decree or entry of an order. 22 SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 created and enacted as follows: 24 Supreme court - Rulemaking authority. The supreme court may adopt rules to 25 implement this Act.
