1 A concurrent resolution for the amendment of subsections 1 and 6 of section 6 of article VIII

2 and sections 12 and 13 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, relating to the names,

3 locations, and missions of the institutions of higher education.

4	STATEMENT OF INTENT		
5	This amendment updates the names of and removes references to the locations and missions		
6	of the institutions of higher education.		
7	BE IT RESOLV	ED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF	
8	REPRE	SENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:	
9	That the following proposed amendments to subsections 1 and 6 of section 6 of		
10	article VIII and sections 12 and 13 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota are agreed to		
11	and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the general election to be		
12	held in 1998, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota.		
13	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsections 1 and 6 of section 6 of article VIII of the		
14	Constitution of North Dakota is amended and reenacted as follows:		
15	1. A	The state board of higher education, to be officially known as the state board of	
16	hig	her education, is hereby created for the shall control and administration of the	
17	foll	owing state educational institutions, to wit administer:	
18	a.	The state university and school of mines, at Grand Forks, with their	
19		substations.	
20	b.	The state agricultural college and experiment station, at Fargo, with their	
21		substations.	
22	C.	The school of science, at Wahpeton.	
23	d.	The state normal schools and teachers colleges, at Valley City, Mayville,	
24		Minot, and Dickinson.	
25	e.	The school of forestry, at Bottineau.	

1		<u>a.</u>	The university of North Dakota;
2		<u>b.</u>	North Dakota state university;
3		<u>C.</u>	Dickinson state university;
4		<u>d.</u>	Mayville state university;
5		<u>e.</u>	Minot state university;
6		<u>f.</u>	Valley City state university;
7		<u>g.</u>	<u>Minot state university - Bottineau;</u>
8		<u>h.</u>	North Dakota state college of science;
9	f .	<u>i.</u>	And such any other state institutions of higher education as may hereafter be
10			established.
11	6.	a.	The state board of higher education shall hold its first meeting at the office of
12			the state board of administration at Bismarck, on the 6th day of July, 1939,
13			and shall organize and elect one of its members as president of such board
14			for a term of one year. It shall also at said meeting, or as soon thereafter as
15			may be practicable, elect a competent person as secretary, who shall reside
16			during his term of office in the city of Bismarck, North Dakota. Said secretary
17			shall hold office at the will of the board. As soon as said board is established
18			and organized, it shall assume all the powers and perform all the duties now
19			conferred by law upon the board of administration in connection with the
20			several institutions hereinbefore mentioned, and the said board of
21			administration shall immediately upon the organization of said state board of
22			higher education, surrender and transfer to said state board of higher
23			education all duties, rights, and powers granted to it under the existing laws of
24			this state concerning the institutions hereinbefore mentioned, together with all
25			property, deeds, records, reports, and appurtenances of every kind belonging
26			or appertaining to said institutions.
27		b.	The said state board of higher education shall have full authority over the
28			institutions under its control with the right, among its other powers, to
29			prescribe, limit, or modify the courses offered at the several institutions. In
30			furtherance of its powers, the state board of higher education shall have the
31			power to delegate to its employees details of the administration of the

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- institutions under its control. The said state board of higher education shall
 have full authority to organize or reorganize within constitutional and statutory
 limitations, the work of each institution under its control, and do each and
 everything necessary and proper for the efficient and economic administration
 of said state educational institutions.
- 6 e. b. Said The board shall prescribe for all of said institutions standard systems of
 7 accounts and records and shall biennially, and within six (6) months
 8 immediately preceding the regular session of the legislature, make a report to
 9 the governor, covering in detail the operations of the educational institutions
 10 under its control.
- 11 It shall be the duty of the heads of the several state institutions hereinbefore d. <u>c.</u> 12 mentioned, to submit the budget requests for the biennial appropriations for 13 said the institutions to said the state board of higher education; and said the 14 state board of higher education shall consider said the budgets and shall 15 revise the same as in its judgment shall be for the best interests of the 16 educational system of the state; and thereafter the state board of higher 17 education shall prepare and present to the state budget board and to the 18 legislature a single unified budget covering the needs of all the institutions 19 under its control. "Said budget shall be prepared and presented by the board 20 of administration until the state board of higher education organizes as 21 provided in subsection 6a." The appropriations for all of said the institutions 22 shall be contained in one legislative measure. The budgets and appropriation 23 measures for the agricultural experiment stations and their substations and 24 the extension division of the North Dakota state university of agriculture and 25 applied science may be separate from those of state educational institutions. 26 e. <u>d.</u> The said state board of higher education shall have the control of the 27 expenditure of the funds belonging to, and allocated to such institutions and 28 also those appropriated by the legislature, for the institutions of higher

education in this state; provided, however, that funds appropriated by the legislature and specifically designated for any one or more of such institutions, shall not be used for any other institution.

3	Sec	tion 12. The following public institutions of the state are permanently located at the		
4	places here	places hereinafter named, each to have the lands specifically granted to it by the United States		
5	in the Act of	f Congress approved February 22, 1889, to be disposed of and used in such		
6	manner as the legislative assembly may prescribe subject to the limitations provided in the			
7	article on school and public lands contained in this constitution.			
8	1.	The seat of government at the city of Bismarck in the county of Burleigh.		
9	2.	The state university and the school of mines at the city of Grand Forks, in the		
10		county of Grand Forks.		
11	3.	The North Dakota state university of agriculture and applied science at the city of		
12		Fargo, in the county of Cass.		
13	4.	A state normal school at the city of Valley City, in the county of Barnes, and the		
14		legislative assembly, in apportioning the grant of eighty thousand acres of land for		
15		normal schools made in the Act of Congress referred to shall grant to the said		
16		normal school at Valley City, as aforementioned, fifty thousand (50,000) acres, and		
17		said lands are hereby appropriated to said institution for that purpose.		
18	5.	The school for the deaf and dumb of North Dakota at the city of Devils Lake, in the		
19		county of Ramsey.		
20	6. <u>3.</u>	A state training industrial school at the city of Mandan, in the county of Morton.		
21	7.	A state normal school at the city of Mayville, in the county of Traill, and the		
22		legislative assembly in apportioning the grant of lands made by Congress in the		
23		Act aforesaid for state normal schools shall assign thirty thousand (30,000) acres		
24		to the institution hereby located at Mayville, and said lands are hereby		
25		appropriated for said purpose.		
26	8. <u>4.</u>	A state hospital for the insane mentally ill at the city of Jamestown, in the county of		
27		Stutsman. And the The legislative assembly shall appropriate twenty thousand		
28		acres of the grant of lands made by the Act of Congress aforesaid for other		
29		educational and charitable institutions to the benefit and for the endowment of said		
30		institution, and there shall be located the state hospital.		

1	<u>5.</u>	An institution for the developmentally disabled at or near the city of Grafton, in the		
2		county of Walsh, an institution for the feebleminded, on the grounds purchased by		
3		the secretary of the interior for a penitentiary building.		
4	SEC	TION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 13 of article IX of the Constitution of North		
5	Dakota is ar	mended and reenacted as follows:		
6	Sec	Section 13. The following public institutions are located as provided, each to have so		
7	much of the	much of the remaining grant of one hundred seventy thousand acres of land made by the		
8	United States for "other educational and charitable institutions" as is allotted by law:			
9	1.	A soldiers' veterans' home, when located, or such other charitable institution as the		
10		legislative assembly may determine, at the city of Lisbon in the county of Ransom,		
11		with a grant of forty thousand acres of land.		
12	2.	The school for the blind at the city of Grand Forks in the county of Grand Forks or		
13		at such other another location as may be determined by the legislative assembly to		
14		be in the best interests of the students of such the institution and the state of North		
15		Dakota .		
16	3.	A school of forestry, or such other institution as the legislative assembly may		
17		determine, at such place in one of the counties of McHenry, Ward, Bottineau, or		
18		Rolette, as the electors of said counties may determine by an election for that		
19		purpose, to be held as provided by the legislative assembly.		
20	4.	A school of science or such other educational or charitable institution as the		
21		legislative assembly may prescribe, at the city of Wahpeton in the county of		
22		Richland, with a grant of forty thousand acres.		
23	5.	A state college at the city of Minot in the county of Ward.		
24	6.	A state college at the city of Dickinson in the county of Stark.		
25	7.	A state hospital for the mentally ill at such a place within this state as shall be		
26		selected by the legislative assembly.		
27	No other institution of a character similar to any one of those located by article IX, section 12, or			
28	this section	this section shall may be established or maintained without an amendment of this constitution.
