HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3027

1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress and state and local government leaders to seek an

2 end to bidding wars among states and local governments for economic develop projects.

WHEREAS, state and local units of government offer targeted incentives to promote
their respective economic development objectives; and

WHEREAS, incentives, which are provided to secure a competitive advantage in
bidding wars between communities competing to attract a relocating business, are sharply
differentiated from assistance, which is offered to enable businesses and entrepreneurs to meet
the financial and operational challenges of legitimate business development and expansion;
and
WHEREAS, those objectives frequently focus on attracting businesses to move from

one locality to another, representing a loss of jobs and revenues in the locality from which the
business departed equal to the gain in jobs and revenues at the new site of the relocated
business; and

WHEREAS, the result of such economic piracy provides no net gain to the UnitedStates economy; and

WHEREAS, the locality offering the incentives experiences a diminished capacity to
support essential educational, infrastructure, and other costs of maintaining a highly competitive
business environment; and

WHEREAS, in the developing global economy, the education and skills of our workers,
the quality and capacity of our infrastructure, the equity of our tax structure, and the quality of
life in our communities is critical to our success as a global competitor; and

WHEREAS, the trend in the magnitude and the nature of the incentives offered to lurebusinesses to new locations is toward unbounded excess; and

WHEREAS, the burden of financing these incentives may be inequitably distributed
among the citizens and businesses of the incentive-providing community; and

1 WHEREAS, states and local units of government might be better served, and achieve a 2 higher level of global economic competitiveness, by diversion of their economic development 3 investment dollars from the granting of excessive incentives to the attainment of a less 4 burdensome tax climate, a better trained and more productive work force, enhanced 5 infrastructure, a quality transportation system, and a generally improved quality of life; and 6 WHEREAS, no single state can unilaterally disarm in this competition between the 7 states; 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 9 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 10 That the North Dakota Legislative Assembly strongly urges the North Dakota 11 Congressional delegation to support legislation, in the United States Congress, that will begin 12 the process of disarmament in the economic war among the states, especially as it relates to 13 the granting of incentives to lure businesses from one locality to another; and 14 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the North Dakota Legislative Assembly strongly 15 urges governors and legislatures in the respective states, as well as mayors and other leaders 16 of local units of government throughout the nation to promulgate this message; and 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this 18 resolution to the members of the North Dakota Congressional delegation, to the Speaker and 19 the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, to the President Pro Tempore and the

Secretary of the United States Senate, and to the governors and the appropriate officers of the

21 legislatures of all the other states.
