## ENGROSSED HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3027

| 1  | A concurrent resolution urging Congress and state and local government leaders to seek an           |
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| 2  | end to bidding wars among states and local governments for economic develop projects.               |
| 3  | WHEREAS, state and local units of government offer targeted incentives to promote                   |
| 4  | their respective economic development objectives; and   |
| 5  | WHEREAS, incentives, which are provided to secure a competitive advantage in                        |
| 6  | bidding wars between communities competing to attract a relocating business, are sharply            |
| 7  | differentiated from assistance, which is offered to enable businesses and entrepreneurs to          |
| 8  | meet the financial and operational challenges of legitimate business development and                |
| 9  | expansion; and  |
| 10 | WHEREAS, those objectives frequently focus on attracting businesses to move from                    |
| 11 | one locality to another, representing a loss of jobs and revenues in the locality from which the    |
| 12 | business departed equal to the gain in jobs and revenues at the new site of the relocated           |
| 13 | business; and   |
| 14 | WHEREAS, the result of such economic piracy provides no net gain to the United                      |
| 15 | States economy; and   |
| 16 | WHEREAS, the locality offering the incentives experiences a diminished capacity to                  |
| 17 | support essential educational, infrastructure, and other costs of maintaining a highly              |
| 18 | competitive business environment; and   |
| 19 | WHEREAS, in the developing global economy, the education and skills of our workers                  |
| 20 | the quality and capacity of our infrastructure, the equity of our tax structure, and the quality of |
| 21 | life in our communities is critical to our success as a global competitor; and                      |
| 22 | WHEREAS, the trend in the magnitude and the nature of the incentives offered to lure                |
| 23 | businesses to new locations is toward unbounded excess; and   |
| 24 | WHEREAS, the burden of financing these incentives may be inequitably distributed                    |
| 25 | among the citizens and businesses of the incentive-providing community; and                         |

| WHEREAS, states and local units of government might be better served, and achieve a             |
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| higher level of global economic competitiveness, by diversion of their economic development     |
| investment dollars from the granting of excessive incentives to the attainment of a less        |
| burdensome tax climate, a better trained and more productive work force, enhanced               |
| infrastructure, a quality transportation system, and a generally improved quality of life; and  |
| WHEREAS, no single state can unilaterally disarm in this competition between the                |
| states;   |
| NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES                                  |
| OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:   |
| That the North Dakota Legislative Assembly strongly urges the North Dakota                      |
| Congressional delegation to support legislation, in the United States Congress, that will begin |
| the process of disarmament in the economic war among the states, especially as it relates to    |
| the granting of incentives to lure businesses from one locality to another; and                 |
| BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the North Dakota Legislative Assembly strongly                     |
| urges the National Governors Association to study and address the use of incentives as an       |
| economic development tool in interstate competition; and  |
| BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the North Dakota Legislative Assembly strongly                     |
| urges governors and legislatures in the respective states, as well as mayors and other leaders  |
| of local units of government throughout the nation to promulgate this message; and              |
| BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this                      |
| resolution to the members of the North Dakota Congressional delegation, to the Speaker and      |
| the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, to the President Pro Tempore and the   |
| Secretary of the United States Senate, and to the governors and the appropriate officers of the |
| legislatures of all the other states.   |
