MADAM PRESIDENT: The House has passed and your favorable consideration is requested on: HB 1044, HB 1045, HB 1079, HB 1085, HB 1107.

ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE SPEAKER

SPEAKER TIMM ANNOUNCED that the Rules for Decorum in the House Chamber would be printed in the Journal.

RULES FOR DECORUM

- 1. No food is permitted on the floor of the House when the House is convened.
- 2. Pictures, including video camera taping, are not permitted to be taken anytime, except by the press, House, and caucus employees or designees.
- 3. No one is permitted to sleep or rest in a prone position on the seats which line both sides of Memorial Hall between the House and Senate Chambers.
- 4. Every member must vote, if they are in the House Chamber, during a roll call vote.
- 5. When a Roll Call vote is taken, every member shall be in their seat and register their own vote, or call out their name and vote in a voice loud enough for the Speaker to hear. The Majority and Minority Leader and their assistants are exempt from the provisions of this rule.
- 6. During debate, members are to be attentive and quiet, and the noise behind the rail shall be held to a minimum.
- 7. No member shall have more than one guest per day seated with the member on the floor at any one time.
- 8. No one is permitted to visit or lean over the back railing.
- 9. The Sergeant-at-Arms shall clear the floor of the House Chamber in front of the railing of all persons, except legislators, legislative employees, legislative guests, former members of the Legislative Assembly, and members of the press, during the time period commencing thirty minutes before the House convenes on any legislative day until the House recesses for that calendar day.
- 10. Tour groups will not be allowed at the front desk area.
- 11. Legislators and employees shall be suitably attired.
- 12. When a Legislator is speaking, the Sergeant-at-Arms will not allow guests to enter that section.
- 13. When the Speaker is putting the question, no member shall walk out or across the floor of the House.
- 14. When a member is speaking, no person shall pass between the person speaking and the Chair.
- 15. A member desiring to speak shall rise and respectfully address the Speaker and shall remain in place before proceeding to speak until recognized by the Chair.
- 16. Visitors sitting in lower tier of seats in House balcony shall not touch, lean over, place objects on, or put their feet on brass railings.
- 17. While the House is convened, no person shall read newspapers or other large publications in an unfolded and conspicuous manner.
- 18. All persons shall wear identification badges while in the House Chamber or in the employ of the House.
- 19. Any member seeing a violation of these directives, or who has a question or problem, should advise the Sergeant-at-Arms or an assistant as soon as possible.

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- 20. All materials placed on desks must be authorized by a House member or individually addressed to each member.
- 21. House Rule 306 No member may speak more than twice on the same subject except the person carrying the bill, committee chairman, or floor leaders.

HB 1352: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a board of early childhood services; and to amend and reenact section 50-11.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood services.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Rep. Keiser introduced:

HB 1353: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 44-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to name changes of notaries public; to amend and reenact sections 44-06-04, 44-06-05, 44-06-11, 44-06-13, 44-06-13.1, and 44-06-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to bonds, seals, commissions, and fees of notaries public; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry**, **Business and Labor Committee**.

Reps. Poolman, Mahoney, Jensen and Sens. Krebsbach, Lindaas, Mutch introduced:

HB 1354: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 10-30.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of a qualified entity for purposes of venture capital corporations.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Reps. Sandvig, Brown, Callahan and Sens. Klein, O'Connell, Wanzek introduced:

HB 1355: A BILL for an Act to provide for immunity for any person that does not provide health care services because of a religious or moral conviction.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Reps. Sandvig, Koppelman, Boehm and Sens. Solberg, B. Stenehjem, Wanzek introduced:

HB 1356: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a prohibition on the use of public funds for assisted suicide.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

SB 2031: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-40.1-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to state transportation payments to school districts.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

SB 2086: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 6-09.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the protection of service provided or made available by a political subdivision through a loan from the municipal bond bank or any other state agency or enterprise.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

SB 2087: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 6-09.4-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the required debt service reserve of the municipal bond bank; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SCR 4001: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to monitor mental health and foster care services.
