BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,800,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of reimbursing school districts for technology expenditures, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999. The superintendent shall determine the maximum amount to which each school district is entitled by dividing the number of elementary and secondary students in average daily membership in this state into the funds appropriated by this section and then multiplying the result by the number of students in average daily membership in the district. Upon receiving substantiating documentation from a school district indicating the expenditure of funds on or after July 1, 1997, has been used for the acquisition of computer technology for student uses or instructional purposes, interactive television, or teacher inservice programs related to the use of computer technology in classroom instruction, the superintendent shall provide reimbursement to the school district in an amount equal to that expended but not exceeding that to which the school district is entitled."
