Fifty-fifth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, January 10, 1997

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Myrdal presiding.

The prayer was offered by Senator Judy Lee.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senators Bowman and Redlin.

A quorum was declared by the President.

REPORT OF PROCEDURAL COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT: Your procedural **Rules Committee (Sen. Goetz, Chairman)** recommends the following amendments to the Senate Rules of the Fifty-fifth Legislative Assembly, and that the reading of these amendments be dispensed with:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsections 5 and 6 of Senate Rule 204 are amended as follows:

- The permanent journals must be bound in hard covers. Two of these sets must be deposited with the Secretary of State, who shall preserve these sets and attach the Secretary of State's certificate thereto showing the date of delivery and attesting that the copies are identical and official journals as delivered to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall retain four sets and shall forward one set to the Supreme Court Library, one set to the Law School Library at the University of North Dakota, eight sets to the State Library, one set to the Lieutenant Governor, two sets to the Attorney General, three seven sets to the Legislative Council, one set to the Secretary of the Senate, and one set to each judicial district as determined by the presiding judge of the district.
- 6. The Secretary of the Senate shall compile five two sets of the daily journals. The Secretary of State shall distribute these sets of the journal as prescribed by the Legislative Council. Of the remaining sets not distributed as prescribed by the Legislative Council, the Secretary of State may distribute these sets to public officials upon their request if in the discretion of the Secretary of State the public official needs the journals to carry on the functions of office. The Secretary of State may dispose of any of these sets not distributed by the time the next Legislative Assembly convenes.

SEN. GOETZ MOVED that the report be adopted, which motion prevailed on a voice vote.
