SB 2365: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 1-03-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the designation of Four Chaplains Sunday.

REQUEST

SEN. THANE REQUESTED that his remarks be printed in the Journal, which request was granted.

SEN THANE: We received excellent testimony which was emotional and difficult for the several people who spoke and said "we don't have enough heroes" or that "we will be soon passing from the scene."

The bill is simple: It says that the Governor shall issue a proclamation designating the first Sunday of February as Four Chaplains Sunday to honor the Four Army Chaplains, George L. Fox, Alexander D. Goode, Clark V. Poling, and John P. Washington, who sacrificed their own lives to save the lives of other servicemen on the Dorchester, a troop transport that was torpedoed off the coast of Greenland on February 3, 1943.

I have placed on your desk a copy of the story appearing in the February 1997 American Legion magazine. It tells the basic story. Four Chaplains - two Protestant, one Catholic, and one Jewish - who through an act of love made the ultimate sacrifice. Of the 900 men aboard the ship, less than 300 survived. Written accounts of our conflicts point out hundreds, if not thousands, of acts of courage and bravery and heroism brought about by the basic human emotions - anger, yes, even fear, self-preservation, and occasionally love.

I have before me four books that give accounts of bravery and courage:

- 1. The Longest Day An account of the Normandy landings.
- Heroes of World War II An account of medal of honor recipients such as the conscientious objector, a medic, who was derided and abused by his fellow servicemen until the last battle of Okinawa, in 1945, when he personally saved the lives of over 70 wounded men.
- 3. <u>Chosin</u> An account of the Korean Conflict and the withdrawal from the Chosin Reservoir.
- 4. We were Soldiers Once and Young An account of the la Drang battle, 1965, in Vietnam.

You might ask now: "What's your point?"

Future generations will not have old soldiers to give accounts of what took place, and most old soldiers are reluctant to talk about painful memories.

So what will happen? When these generations are surfing the net or exploring cyberspace, who will tell them about the bravery and courage and sacrifices made in our conflicts that provided them the freedoms they enjoy?

Let us hope that this proclamation, when issued by future Governors, will cause these young citizens of the 21st Century to pause and say, "What kind of men were these who would willingly give up their lives for a friend?" and then, just maybe, they would look between the covers of books such as these and be moved and inspired by these accounts. All old soldiers ferverently hope that will be the case.
