## FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

Reps. Aarsvold, Dalrymple and Sens. Andrist, LaFountain, St. Aubyn introduced:  
(At the request of the Governor)

**HB 1001:** A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the office of the governor; and to amend and reenact sections 54-07-04 and 54-08-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salaries of the governor and lieutenant governor.

Reps. Bernstein, Devlin and Sen. Kringstad introduced:

**HB 1005:** A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state treasurer; and to amend and reenact section 54-11-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the state treasurer.

**HB 1175:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 34-07-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the contents of employment certificates.

**HB 1399:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 32-21-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to persons who may bring a wrongful death action.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee.**

Reps. Boehm, Dorso, Huether introduced:

**HB 1428:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 26.1-36 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to coverage for off-label uses of drugs.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee.**

## REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE

**HB 1001, as reengrossed:** Transportation Committee (Rep. Weisz, Chairman) recommends **AMENDMENTS AS FOLLOWS** and when so amended, recommends **DO NOT PASS** and **BE REREFERRED** to the **Human Services Committee** (12 YEAS, 45 NAYS, 0 ABSENT AND NOT VOTING).
