1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 1-03-05 and subsection 1 of section 16.1-01-09

2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to acts performed on Saturdays and business days.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 1-03-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

1-03-05. Act due on holiday performed on next day. Whenever an act of a secular
nature, other than a work of necessity or mercy, is appointed by law or contract to be performed
upon a particular day, which that falls upon a Saturday or a holiday, such the act may be
performed upon the next business day with the same effect as if it had been performed upon
the day appointed.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 16.1-01-09 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 131. a.A request of the secretary of state for approval of a petition to initiate or refer14a measure may be presented over the signatures of the sponsoring15committee on individual signature forms that have been notarized. The16secretary of state shall prepare a signature form that includes provisions for17identification of the measure; the printed name, signature, and address of the18committee member; and notarization of the signature.
- 19b.Upon receipt of a petition to initiate or refer a measure, the secretary of state20shall draft a short and concise statement which must that fairly represent21represents the measure. The statement must be submitted to the attorney22general for approval or disapproval. An approved statement must be affixed23to the petition before it is circulated for signatures, must be called the "ballot24title", and must be placed immediately before the full text of the measure.
