- A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the various divisions under the supervision of the director of the office of management and budget; to provide an exemption from the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code; to
- 4 provide a statement of legislative intent relating to state employee compensation adjustments;
- 5 to authorize transfer of various special funds to the general fund; to provide for mobile data
- 6 terminals; to provide directives relating to 911 telephone services; to provide for program
- 7 reductions if federal programs are terminated or reduced; to provide for a transfer from the
- 8 North Dakota insurance reserve fund to the office of management and budget; to provide for a
- 9 transfer from the information services division operating fund to the state general fund; to
- 10 provide legislative intent regarding legislative renovations; and to amend and reenact sections
- 11 32-12.2-06 and 54-27.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state risk
- management fund and to the budget stabilization fund; to provide an expiration date; and to
- 13 declare an emergency.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the various divisions under the supervision of the director of the office of management and budget for the purpose of defraying their expenses, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999, as follows:

29	SECTION 2. ADDITIONAL INCOME. All income in excess of estimated income in the		
30	budget appropriated by the legislative assembly to the office of management and budget for the		
31	biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999, must be deposited in the		

- appropriate operating funds in the state treasury and may only be expended with the
 authorization of the emergency commission. Income exceeding \$50,000 must be approved by
- 3 the budget section.

- SECTION 3. LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. Upon approval of the emergency commission, the director of the office of management and budget may transfer between various line items in subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of section 1 of this Act appropriation authority of up to ten percent of a given line item to adjust for changing circumstances in meeting established performance measures. Any further transfers must be approved by the budget section.
 - **SECTION 4. CAPITOL BUILDING FUND.** The amount of \$605,850, or so much of the sum as is necessary, included in the estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is to be spent by the facility management division from the capitol building fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.
 - **SECTION 5. EXEMPTION.** The fiscal management appropriation contained in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 37 of the 1995 Session Laws is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 for up to an amount of \$800,000 and any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available for continued development and operating costs of the accounting, management, and payroll systems during the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.

SECTION 6. INTENT - STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION ADJUSTMENTS - GUIDELINES. It is the intent of the fifty-fifth legislative assembly that 1997-99 compensation adjustments for permanent state employees are to be increases of 1.5 percent beginning with the month of July 1997, to be paid in August 1997, and another 1.5 percent beginning with the month of July 1998, to be paid in August 1998.

In addition, the fifty-fifth legislative assembly has appropriated an additional 1.5 percent employee pay increase each year of the biennium to be used by agency and institution directors to address compression problems and provide merit increases. The additional increases are to be paid in August 1997 for the first year of the biennium and in August 1998 for the second year of the biennium.

Probationary employees and employees whose documented performance levels do not meet standards are not eligible for the general or additional increases.

1 During the biennium, no general salary increase other than the 1.5 percent in July 1997 2 and the 1.5 percent in July 1998 may be given to an employee whose salary exceeds or would 3 exceed the salary range maximum. 4 It is the intent of the fifty-fifth legislative assembly that the workers compensation 5 bureau receive its 1997-99 employee compensation adjustment in a lump sum amount of 6 \$508,406 to provide pay raises based on merit and performance throughout the 1997-99 7 biennium. 8 **SECTION 7. INTENT.** Within the authority included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this 9 Act, are the following grants and special items: \$ 10 53,000 Boys and girls clubworks 11 State contingencies 500,000 12 State memberships and related expenses 307,500 13 Firemen's association 63,000 14 Unemployment insurance 2,000,000 25.000 15 Capitol grounds planning commission 16 SECTION 8. TRANSFER. During the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending 17 June 30, 1999, the director of the office of management and budget is authorized to transfer 18 special funds to the general fund as follows: 19 Lands and minerals trust fund \$ 5,500,000 20 State aid distribution fund 39,372,706 SECTION 9. FIRE AND TORNADO FUND. The amount of \$63,000, or so much of the 21 22 amount as is necessary, included in the estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 23 of this Act, is from the fire and tornado fund. 24 **SECTION 10. MOBILE DATA TERMINALS.** Of the amounts included in the operating 25 and equipment line items in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, \$266,180 and \$573,201, 26 respectively, provide for radio tower upgrades for mobile data terminals. These funds may not 27 be expended prior to the completion of the mobile data communications plan provided for in the 28 highway patrol appropriation. 29 SECTION 11. STATE RADIO - 911 SERVICES. As required by section 18 of 1995 30 Senate Bill No. 2015, the fifty-fifth legislative assembly specifically provides state radio 31 communications with the authority to expand its 911 services beyond the twenty-county limit set

1	by the fifty-fourth legislative assembly. The authority to add Golden Valley county to its 911
2	service begins with the effective date of this Act and ends on June 30, 1999. State radio
3	communications is then limited to providing 911 services to the counties being served as of
4	June 30, 1999.
5	SECTION 12. FEDERAL PROGRAM TERMINATIONS - BLOCK GRANT - FUNDING
6	REDUCTIONS - RELATED PROGRAM REDUCTIONS - REPORTS TO THE BUDGET
7	SECTION. If the federal government during the 1997-99 biennium terminates funding for any
8	program administered by an agency, department, or institution of the state of North Dakota, the
9	agency, department, or institution, subject to budget section approval, may terminate the
10	program and not replace the reduction in federal funds with state funds, notwithstanding any
11	other provision of law. If the federal government combines funding for separate programs in a
12	block grant resulting in a reduction of total federal funds available for those programs, the
13	administering agency, department, or institution may, subject to budget section approval,
14	prioritize or reprioritize programs as necessary in making programmatic reductions. The
15	agency, department, or institution may administer funds available under a new federal block
16	grant or similar measure, consistent with the terms of that measure, notwithstanding any other
17	provisions of law intended to conform to or implement the provisions of the repealed federal
18	Act, and shall report any program terminations, reductions, or changes resulting from this
19	section to the budget section of the legislative council for its approval.
20	SECTION 13. RISK MANAGEMENT. The North Dakota insurance reserve fund shall
21	transfer \$5,000,000 of excess equity investment in the North Dakota insurance reserve fund to
22	the office of management and budget on July 1, 1997. This transfer represents final settlement
23	with the North Dakota insurance reserve fund for any claim by the state to any funds held in
24	reserve by the North Dakota insurance reserve fund for claims pending before July 1, 1997.
25	The recovery of the \$5,000,000, together with current reserves in the risk management
26	fund, are considered sufficient reserves for claims anticipated in the 1997-99 biennium.
27	Therefore, the following amounts shall be deducted from the budgets for risk management
28	premiums as indicated:

SECTION 14. TRANSFER. The director of the office of management and budget shall transfer \$550,000, or an amount equal to the 1997-99 biennium costs relating to the information technology management division of the legislative council, whichever is less, from the information services operating fund to the general fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999. The transfer is to reimburse the general fund for costs relating to information technology research, planning, monitoring, reviewing, and auditing and

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- 1 for assistance provided to agencies by the information technology management division of the 2 legislative council.
- 3 SECTION 15. INTENT - LEGISLATIVE RENOVATIONS. It is the intent of the fifty-fifth 4 legislative assembly that the facility management division of the office of management and 5 budget convert, during the 1997-99 biennium, the house of representatives lounge into a house 6 committee room. The house conference room is then to be renovated and used to provide 7 space and three telephone lines for the doctor of the day.
 - SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 32-12.2-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 32-12.2-06. (Contingent expiration date - see Note) Liability insurance -
- 11 Reinsurance. Upon approval of the director of the office of management and budget, an entity
- 12 of the state may participate in a government self-insurance pool or may purchase insurance
- 13 against liability of the entity and its employees for damages resulting from claims under this
- 14 chapter. The director shall limit participation in government self-insurance pools and, except as
- 15 provided in this section, the purchase of insurance to exposures determined to cause an
- 16 excessive financial risk to the state risk management fund including exposures reasonably
- 17 expected to deplete the fund and have a significant detrimental impact on the state's budget.
- 18 The director shall develop a state self-insurance program that provides as much coverage as
- 19 possible of potential liability recognized by this chapter, but that includes supplemental
- 20 insurance purchases in a manner that is determined appropriate by the director in consultation
- 21 with the state risk manager. The insurance may be provided by an insurance company
- 22 authorized to do business in this state which the commissioner of insurance has determined to
- 23 be responsible and financially sound, considering the extent of the coverage required, or
- 24 coverage may be provided by a government self-insurance pool. If a premium savings will
- 25 result and the director of the office of management and budget approves, the insurance policy
- 26 or memorandum of coverage may be in force from one through three years from the date of
- 27 issue. The director may procure an excess loss reinsurance contract for the state.
 - **SECTION 17. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-27.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

 - 54-27.2-02. (Effective until June 30, 1997) Certain general fund revenues to be deposited in the budget stabilization fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law

- 3 budget stabilization fund. For purposes of this section, "at the end of any biennium" means
- 4 after cancellation of unexpended appropriations under section 54-44.1-11.
- 5 (Effective June 30, 1997) Certain general fund revenues to be deposited in the
- 6 budget stabilization fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law except section
- 7 54-27.2 01, any amount in the state general fund in excess of forty million dollars at the end of
- 8 any biennium must be transferred by the state treasurer to the budget stabilization fund. For
- 9 purposes of this section, "at the end of any biennium" means after cancellation of unexpended
- 10 appropriations under section 54-44.1-11.
- 11 **SECTION 18. EXPIRATION DATE.** Section 17 of this Act is effective through June 30,
- 12 1999, and after that date is ineffective.
- 13 **SECTION 19. EMERGENCY.** Section 17 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
- 14 measure.
