1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 39-12-02 and

2 subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 39-12-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

3 an exemption from width, height, and weight limitations for commercial portable grain cleaners.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 39-12-02 of the
 6 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

 The fee for a seasonal permit the ten percent weight exemption, harvest and wintertime, is fifty dollars per month.

9 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 39-12-04 of the
10 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

11	d.	Commercial movement of haystacks or hay bales with vehicles designed
12		specifically for hauling hay, commercial movement of self-propelled fertilizer
13		spreaders and self-propelled agricultural chemical applicators, whether
14		operating under their own power or being transported by another vehicle,
15		commercial movement of portable grain cleaners, and the commercial
16		movement of hay grinders, which may be moved on the highway after
17		obtaining a seasonal permit issued by the highway patrol. The highway patrol
18		shall issue permits that are valid during daylight hours on any day of the
19		week, or that are valid at all times for the movement of self-propelled fertilizer
20		spreaders and self-propelled agricultural chemical applicators, to any
21		commercial entity otherwise qualified under this subdivision. Self-propelled
22		fertilizer spreaders and self-propelled agricultural chemical applicators
23		operating under their own power between sunset and sunrise must display
24		vehicle hazard warning signal lamps as described in subsection 3 of section

1	39-21-19.1. The permit is in lieu of registration requirements for the permit
2	period. No permit may be issued, unless proof of financial responsibility in a
3	minimum of three hundred thousand dollars is filed and the appropriate permit
4	fee is paid. The permit may also be issued for hauling hay bales with vehicles
5	or vehicle combinations other than those designed specifically for hauling
6	haystacks. This permit, however, will not be in lieu of registration
7	requirements. All permit fees must be deposited in the state highway
8	distribution fund.
