- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the interim reciprocal certification of teachers; and to declare an
- 3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:

7 Interim reciprocal teaching certificate - Period of validity.

- 8 1. The education standards and practices board shall grant an interim reciprocal 9 teaching certificate in accordance with sections 15-47-46 and 15-41-25 to an 10 individual who holds a valid regular teaching license or certificate from another 11 state, provided:
- a. The certification is based upon a minimum of a bachelor's degree with a
 major that meets the issuing state's requirements in elementary education,
 middle-level education, or a content area taught in public high school;
- b. The certification requires the completion of a professional education
 sequence from a state-approved teacher education program, including
 supervised student teaching;
- 18 c. The individual submits to a background check as required of initial applicants
 19 in section 15-38-18.2;
- 20d.The background check reveals nothing for which a North Dakota applicant21would be denied initial certification; and
- e. The individual submits a plan for meeting all requirements necessary tobecome a certificated teacher in this state.

1	2.	An interim reciprocal certificate granted under this section is valid for two years.
2		The individual shall submit evidence of progress on the individual's educational
3		plan to the education standards and practices board at the end of the two-year
4		period. The interim reciprocal certificate may be renewed for one additional
5		two-year period if satisfactory progress is demonstrated.
6	3.	Notwithstanding any other law, an interim reciprocal certificate granted under this
7		section is the equivalent of a teaching certificate granted under chapter 15-36.
8	SEC	CTION 2. A new section to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	created and	enacted as follows:
10	Rec	iprocal acceptance of teaching certificates - Report. On or before July 1, 2001,
11	the education standards and practices board shall pursue the reciprocal acceptance of teaching	
12	certificates	issued by other states. The education standards and practices board shall present
13	a progress	report regarding implementation of the program to the legislative council or to a
14	committee	designated by the council before October 1, 2000.
15	SEC	CTION 3. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
