- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-44.8 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a disability telecommunications advisory council.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. If Senate Bill No. 2043 does not become effective, a new section to chapter 54-44.8 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Disability telecommunications advisory council. The disability telecommunications

advisory council consists of seven members appointed by the governor. The governor shall appoint to the council two consumers who are deaf, one consumer who is hard of hearing, one consumer with a communications disability other than deafness or being hard of hearing, one representative from the information services division, one representative from the vocational rehabilitation division, and one representative from a telecommunications company. The

12 council shall hold at least two meetings annually and may hold additional meetings as deemed

necessary by the division. The division shall provide administrative services for the council.

14 The council shall advise the division, the public service commission, and the vocational

rehabilitation division on all matters concerning telecommunication relay services and the

16 specialized telecommunications equipment distribution program. Council members who are not

state or local government officers or employees are entitled to be reimbursed for their

necessary and actual expenses incurred in performance of their duties from moneys
