1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 11-10-10 and 11-10-10.1 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the salaries of county officers; and to provide an effective date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 11-10-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

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11-10-10. Salaries of county officers.

- 7 1. The salary of the county auditor, county treasurer, county superintendent of 8 schools, register of deeds, clerk of district court, and sheriff must be regulated by 9 the population in the respective counties according to the last preceding official 10 federal census from and after the date when the official report of such the census 11 has been published by the director of the census or such other official as may be 12 charged with the duty of making such official publication. Notwithstanding any 13 decreases in population, the salaries paid county officers as of July 1, 1981, 14 reduced by any discretionary salary increase authorized by the county 15 commissioners pursuant to this section, must be at least the minimum amount 16 payable for that office when filled on a full-time basis in the future. 17 2. The county treasurer, county superintendent of schools, register of deeds, county
- auditor, and clerk of district court each shall receive are entitled to the following
 annual salary, payable monthly, for official services rendered:
- a. Seventeen <u>Nineteen</u> thousand dollars in counties having a population of less
 than eight thousand.
- b. Seventeen Nineteen thousand five hundred dollars in counties having a
 population of or exceeding eight thousand plus additional compensation of
 one hundred dollars per year for each one thousand additional population or

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- 1major fraction thereof over eight thousand. However, in counties where the2population consists of more than twenty-five percent Indians who have not3severed tribal relations, the county commissioners may adjust the salaries4provided for herein in this subsection within the limitations contained in this5subdivision.
- 6 The compensation for the clerk of a district court which is funded by the state 7 pursuant to section 11-17-11 must be set by the supreme court as a part of the 8 judicial branch personnel system.

- 10 The county superintendent of schools is entitled to receive for any trips necessarily 4. 11 made within the county in the performance of school district reorganization duties 12 the same mileage received under section 11-10-15. The board of county 13 commissioners of any county may, by resolution, increase the salary of any 14 full-time county official provided in this section, if, in the judgment of such board, by 15 reason of duties performed, the official merits the increase. The salary of a county 16 official may not be reduced during the official's term of office. Any county official 17 performing duties on less than a full-time basis may be paid a reduced salary set 18 by the board of county commissioners. In the event If the county has for its 19 employees, a group insurance program for hospital benefits, medical benefits, or 20 life insurance, or a group retirement program, financed in part or entirely by the 21 county, such the benefits may be in addition to the salaries payable to county 22 officials.
- 23 Each county commissioner may receive an annual salary or per diem as provided 5. 4. 24 by resolution of the board, with a maximum of ten twelve thousand dollars in 25 counties with a population in excess of ten thousand and a maximum of nine 26 eleven thousand three hundred dollars in counties with a population of ten 27 thousand or less. In addition, there must be an allowance for meals and lodging 28 expenses at the same rate and under the same conditions as provided for state officials and employees. The allowance for travel expenses must be at the same 29 30 rate as provided by section 11-10-15, and must be evidenced by a subvoucher or 31 receipt as provided by section 21-05-01. As used in this section, the words "official

- If a board shall resolve resolves to pay an annual salary pursuant to this
 subsection, it must be paid in monthly installments.
- 5 6. 5. Sheriffs shall receive are entitled to the following annual salary, payable monthly,
 6 for official services rendered:
- a. Nineteen <u>Twenty-one</u> thousand nine hundred dollars in counties having a
 population with less than eight thousand.
- 9 Twenty Twenty-two thousand nine hundred dollars in counties having a b. 10 population exceeding eight thousand plus additional compensation of one 11 hundred dollars per year for each one thousand additional population or major 12 fraction thereof over eight thousand. However, in counties where the 13 population consists of more than twenty-five percent Indians who have not 14 severed tribal relations, the county commissioners may adjust the salaries provided for herein in this subsection within the limitations contained in this 15 16 subdivision.
- 17 7. 6. State's attorneys in counties having a population exceeding thirty-five thousand, or 18 in other counties where the board of county commissioners has determined by 19 resolution that the state's attorney shall must be full time and shall may not be an 20 attorney or counsel for any party except the state or county, shall are entitled to 21 receive forty-five forty-seven thousand dollars, but the county may increase that 22 amount up to the same salary as a county district court judge. State's attorneys 23 not considered full time shall receive are entitled to an annual salary of at least 24 forty-five percent of the minimum salary paid to a full-time state's attorney.
- 25 7. Beginning on January 1, 2002, and on January first of each following
 26 even-numbered year, the salary limitations in this section must be increased by the
 27 same percentage as the total percentage increase, if any, that is appropriated by
 28 the legislative assembly and approved by the governor for all full-time classified
 29 state employees. That percentage increase, if any, must be rounded to the nearest
 30 tenth of a percent.

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SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 11-10-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

11-10-10.1. Legislative intent in regard to county salaries. It is the intent of the
legislative assembly that the several boards of county commissioners shall exercise the
responsibility of setting the salaries of county officials within the limits imposed by section
11-10-10. A board of county commissioners, in making a decision in regard to a county
official's salary, should take into account the financial status of the county, the responsibilities of
the position, and any other factors which that the board may deem deems relevant in arriving at
such the decision.

10 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on January 1, 2000.
