HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3016

A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the qualifications, standards,
and the monitoring requirements for quardianship services for incapacitated persons.

3 WHEREAS, the Guardianship Association of North Dakota has been formed; and 4 WHEREAS, a 1996 study of guardianship needs conducted by the Bush Foundation 5 and the Aging Services Division of the North Dakota Department of Human Services 6 determined that a large number of incapacitated persons in the state are in need of 7 guardianship services; and 8 WHEREAS, there is an insufficient number of qualified and available guardians in the 9 state to handle the complex needs of incapacitated persons; and 10 WHEREAS, many family members of incapacitated persons are unable to be guardians 11 due to distance and other factors; and 12 WHEREAS, demographic projections for North Dakota indicate significant increases in 13 the number of elderly persons who will be in need of a range of services; 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE 15 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: 16 That the Legislative Council study the qualifications, standards, and the monitoring 17 requirements for guardianship services for incapacitated persons; and 18 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the study include an examination of other states' 19 gualifications, standards, and monitoring requirements for guardianship services; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and 21 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to 22 the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly.
