ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2087

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 12-59-01, 12-59-02, subsection 2 of section

2 12-59-15, subsection 17 of section 12.1-34-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

3 membership, meetings, and compensation of the parole board, parole revocation proceedings,

4 and fair treatment standards for victims and witnesses of crimes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12-59-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 12-59-01. State parole board - Membership. The state parole board shall consist 9 consists of three six members, who shall must be qualified electors of the state, appointed by 10 the governor for terms of three years, arranged so that the term of one member shall two 11 members must expire on December thirty-first of each year. One of the members shall must be 12 a person experienced in law enforcement, which may include experience as a prosecuting 13 attorney, one shall must be a licensed attorney, and one shall four must be a person persons 14 qualified by special experience, education, or training. Members shall be removable by the The 15 governor may only remove a member of the parole board for disability, inefficiency, neglect of 16 duty, or malfeasance in office.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 12-59-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

19 12-59-02. Meetings - Compensation - Rules. The board governor shall organize by
20 selecting a appoint a member of the parole board to be chairman. The chairman of the parole
21 board shall designate three members of the parole board for each meeting of the parole board.
22 Meetings of the parole board must be held in accordance with rules established by the parole
23 board and must be held as often as required to properly conduct the business of the board, but
24 in any event not less than six times per year. The parole board may only take action upon the

1 concurrence of at least two members who participated in the same meeting. The final decision 2 of at least two parole board members who participated in the same parole board meeting 3 constitutes the decision of the parole board. Members are entitled to be compensated at the 4 rate of sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day for each day actually and necessarily spent in 5 the performance of their duties as board members plus the same mileage and expenses as are 6 authorized for state officials and employees. The director of the division of parole and 7 probation, or the director's designee, shall be is the clerk for the parole board. 8 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 12-59-15 of the North Dakota 9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 2. Upon issuance of a warrant of arrest for a parole violation, the running of the time 11 period of parole must be suspended until the parolec is in the custody of a law 12 enforcement agency parole board issues a final order under this section. The 13 parolee is entitled to credit for time spent in physical custody from the time of 14 arrest until the time the parole board issues a final order. 15 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 17 of section 12.1-34-02 of the North Dakota 16 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 17 17. Participation in parole board and pardon decision. Victims may submit a written 18 statement for consideration by the parole board, the governor, or the pardon 19 advisory board, if one has been appointed, prior to the parole board, the governor, 20 or the pardon advisory board taking any action on a defendant's request for parole 21 or pardon. Victims of violent crimes may at the discretion of the parole board, the 22 governor, or the pardon advisory board personally appear and address the parole 23 board, the governor, or the pardon advisory board. Notice If the offender will make 24 a personal appearance, notice must be given by the parole board or pardon clerk 25 informing the victim of the pending review and of the victim's rights under this 26 section. The victim must be provided notice of the decision of the parole board or 27 of the governor and the recommendations of the pardon advisory board, if any, 28 and, if applicable, notice of the date of the prisoner's release on parole or the 29 prisoner's pardon, conditional pardon, reprieve, commutation, or remission of fine. 30 Notice must be given within a reasonable time after the parole board or the

- 1 governor makes a decision but in any event before the parolee's or pardoned
- 2 prisoner's release from custody.
