BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4	SECTION 1. Consumer access to credit reports - Civil penalty. Upon request by a
5	North Dakota consumer, a consumer credit reporting agency shall allow the consumer to
6	visually inspect the agency's file maintained regarding that consumer at the time of the request;
7	provide to the consumer a decoded version of the consumer's agency file, including all
8	information in the file at the time of the request and an explanation of any code used in the file;
9	and provide to the consumer a record of all inquiries made in the last twelve months to the
10	agency regarding the consumer's file, by recipient, which resulted in the agency providing
11	information concerning the consumer. A consumer credit reporting agency shall provide free of
12	charge to a North Dakota consumer a notice each time the agency receives an inquiry
13	regarding the consumer's file which results in the agency providing information concerning the
14	consumer. The notice also must inform the consumer of the consumer's access rights under
15	this section. This section does not lessen any consumer protection provided by federal law.
16	Except as otherwise provided by state and federal law, a consumer credit reporting agency may
17	charge a consumer a reasonable amount for any information provided under this section. For
18	purposes of this section, "consumer credit reporting agency" means any person that, for fees or
19	dues, or on a cooperative nonprofit basis, regularly engages in the practice of assembling or
20	evaluating consumer credit information or other information on consumers for the purpose of
21	furnishing consumer reports to third parties. A credit reporting agency that violates this section
22	is subject to a civil penalty of one hundred dollars for each violation. The civil penalty may be
23	imposed by a court in a civil proceeding.
