FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SCR 4010: A concurrent resolution to create and enact a new section to article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota, relating to the collection of fees by nongovernmental entities.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

HB 1054: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 15 of section 57-02-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to application of the property tax exemption for farm buildings; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

HB 1138: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to confidentiality of patient records at college and university student health services and university system clinics.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

HB 1140: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 61-35-04, 61-35-07, 61-35-08, and subsection 1 of section 61-35-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to payment of publication costs to create a water district, election of a board of a water district, and notice of dissolution or merger of a rural water corporation or cooperative.

Was read the first time and referred to the Natural Resources Committee.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

HCR 3006: A concurrent resolution expressing legislative approval of the actions taken by the State Bar Association of North Dakota Joint Task Force on Family Law to facilitate and promote mediation as a method of addressing family law matters.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

HCR 3007: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to continue its study of those provisions of Title 15 of the North Dakota Century Code which relate to elementary and secondary education.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator St. Aubyn's motion.
