SPEAKER TIMM ANNOUNCED that the House would be on the Fourth order of business.

COMMUNICATION FROM SECRETARY OF STATE ALVIN A. JAEGER December 3, 1998

According to the provisions of North Dakota Century Code §54-03-03, the Chief Clerk of the North Dakota House of Representatives, at the opening of each organizational session, shall make a correct roll of the members of the House of Representatives to whom Certificates of Election have been issued by the proper officers.

As provided for in NDCC §16.1-15-45, Certificates of Election are prepared by the Secretary of State and then signed by the Secretary of State, the Governor, and a member of the State Canvassing Board. Along with preparing Certificates of Election for statewide elected officials, NDCC §16.1-15-46 also instructs the Secretary of State to issue Certificates of Election to all members of the Legislative Assembly.

Therefore, in accordance with the above stated sections of law, this letter certifies the attached list of members of the House of Representatives as being duly elected. A copy of each member's Certificate of Election has also been included. These legislators were certified on November 18, 1998, by the State Canvassing Board as being duly elected to the North Dakota House of Representatives in the state's General Election held on November 3, 1998. The members from Legislative District's 28, 43, and 49 were certified on December 1 due to the recounts conducted in late November.

Each member certified as being elected has been mailed an Oath of Office SFN 11501 (1-98) to be executed by each legislator as required by Article IV, Section 7 and Article XI, Section 4, of the North Dakota Constitution. Once the Oath of Office has been executed, members have been instructed to file them with this office.

SPEAKER TIMM ANNOUNCED that the House would be on a Special Order of Business.

MOTIONS

REP. NICHOLAS MOVED that the name of Lance Hagen be placed in nomination for the position of Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, which motion prevailed.

REP. CARLSON MOVED that nominations for Chief Clerk cease, which motion prevailed.

REP. R. KELSCH MOVED that the name of Barbara Middaugh be placed in nomination for the position of Desk Reporter for the House of Representatives, which motion prevailed.

REP. NELSON MOVED that nominations for Desk Reporter cease, which motion prevailed.

REP. CARLISLE MOVED that the name of Jerome Moszer be placed in nomination for the position of Sergeant-at-Arms, which motion prevailed.

REP. HENEGAR MOVED that nominations for Sergeant-at-Arms cease, which motion prevailed.

REP. DORSO MOVED that House Rule 206 regarding Group A Employees be suspended and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Lance Hagen as Chief Clerk, Barbara Middaugh as Desk Reporter, and Jerome Moszer as Sergeant-at-Arms, which motion prevailed.

SPEAKER TIMM ADMINISTERED the Oath of Office to Chief Clerk Lance Hagen, Desk Reporter Barbara Middaugh, and Sergeant-at-Arms Jerome Moszer.

MOTIONS

REP. DALRYMPLE MOVED that the name of Frank Wald be placed in nomination for Speaker of the House, which motion prevailed.

REP. GALVIN SECONDED the motion that the name of Frank Wald be placed in nomination for Speaker of the House, which motion prevailed.

REP. MICKELSON MOVED that nominations cease, which motion prevailed.

The vote was taken and Rep. Frank Wald was elected Speaker of the House of Representatives.

REP. MONSON MOVED that a committee of two be appointed to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum, which motion prevailed.

SPEAKER TIMM APPOINTED Reps. N. Johnson and Poolman to such committee and Speaker Wald was escorted to the rostrum.

OATH OF OFFICE

SPEAKER TIMM ADMINISTERED the Oath of Office to Speaker-elect Wald.

SPEAKER WALD PRESENTED SPEAKER TIMM with a gavel as a memento of his term as Speaker.

MOTION

REP. DORSO MOVED that the House adopt as temporary rules the House and Joint Rules of the 55th Legislative Assembly as adopted on Thursday, December 5, 1996 and amended on Thursday, January 9, 1997, and Friday, January 10, 1997, and published in the 1997 Senate and House Rules and Committee Book, and as amended on January 27, 1997, which motion prevailed.

MOTION

REP. DORSO MOVED that the House amend subsections 4 and 5 of Temporary House Rule 361 as follows:

- Seat number 86 is reserved for the Speaker.
- 5. Seat numbers 26, 27, 28, 29, 55, 56, 57, and 58 are reserved.
- 6. The Speaker may also permit extra seats on the floor of the House chamber to be utilized by members of the press, and may reserve certain seats for that purpose.
- When two or more members have exactly the same seniority as determined pursuant to subsection 1, seating among those members must be in ascending numerical order based on the number of the district represented. When two or more members from the same district or multidistrict have equal seniority, the member or members of the party of the Speaker, if any, must be seated first; thereafter members must be listed in alphabetical order for seating purposes.

SPEAKER WALD ANNOUNCED that the House would be on the Fifteenth order of business. Seating of members will be handled according to House Rule 361.
