- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the distribution of federal mineral royalties; and to amend and
- 2 reenact section 15-40.1-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to distribution of federal
- 3 mineral royalty receipts.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. Distribution of federal mineral royalties.** One-half of the moneys paid
- 6 to the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United States under the provisions of an Act
- 7 of Congress entitled "An Act to promote the mining of coal, phosphate, oil, oil shale, gas, and
- 8 sodium on the public domain" [Pub. L. 66-146; 41 Stat. 437; 30 U.S.C. 181 et seq.], popularly
- 9 known as the Minerals Leasing Act of 1920, must be credited to the state general fund and
- 10 <u>distributed to the county in which the minerals generating the royalties are located. The</u>
- 11 moneys must be used by the county for planning, construction and maintenance of public
- 12 facilities, and the provision of public services. This section applies to all royalties paid pursuant
- 13 to the Minerals Leasing Act of 1920 on minerals produced after the effective date of this Act.
- 14 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-40.1-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 15 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15-40.1-13. Receipts from federal funds. All One-half of the moneys paid to the state
- 17 by the secretary of the treasury of the United States under the provisions of an Act of Congress
- 18 entitled "An Act to promote the mining of coal, phosphate, oil, oil shale, gas, and sodium on the
- 19 public domain" [Pub. L. 66-146; 41 Stat. 437; 30 U.S.C. 181 et seq.], must be credited to the
- 20 state general fund and must be distributed only pursuant to the terms of this chapter. Such
- 21 These moneys must be deemed the first moneys withdrawn or expended from the general fund
- 22 for state school aid purposes.
