- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 20.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to posting of lands to prohibit hunting.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **20.1-01-17.** Posting of lands by owner or tenant lessee to prohibit hunting How
- 7 posted Signs defaced and markings protected. Only the owner or tenant lessee of any
- 8 land may post it by placing signs <u>and markings</u> alongside the public highway or the land giving
- 9 notice that no hunting is permitted on the land. The name of the person posting the land must
- 10 appear on each sign in legible characters. The signs must be readable from the outside of the
- 11 land and. Signs or markings must be placed conspicuously not more than at least eight
- hundred eighty yards [804.68 meters] apart, or at the corners of the land, whichever is closer.
- 13 Signs must be placed at the entrance to the land and at all vehicular entrances to the land. As
- 14 to land entirely enclosed by a fence or other enclosure, posting of signs at or on all gates
- 15 through the fence or enclosure vehicular entrances constitutes a posting of all the enclosed
- 16 land. No For purposes of this section, "markings" means fenceposts marked with not less than
- 17 fifty square inches [322.58 square centimeters] of fluorescent orange paint or, if metal
- 18 <u>fenceposts are used, covering the entire post.</u> A person may <u>not</u> in any manner deface, take
- 19 down, or destroy posting signs or markings.
