1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to the interim reciprocal certification of teachers; and to declare an  
3 emergency.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
6 created and enacted as follows:

7 **Interim reciprocal teaching certificate - Period of validity.**

- 8 1. The education standards and practices board shall grant an interim reciprocal  
9 teaching certificate in accordance with sections 15-47-46 and 15-41-25 to an  
10 individual who holds a valid regular teaching license or certificate from another  
11 state, provided:
- 12 a. The certification is based upon a minimum of a bachelor's degree with a  
13 major that meets the issuing state's requirements in elementary education,  
14 middle-level education, or a content area taught in public high school;
  - 15 b. The certification requires the completion of a professional education  
16 sequence from a state-approved teacher education program, including  
17 supervised student teaching;
  - 18 c. The individual submits to a background check as required of initial applicants  
19 in section 15-38-18.2;
  - 20 d. The background check reveals nothing for which a North Dakota applicant  
21 would be denied initial certification; and
  - 22 e. The individual submits a plan for meeting all requirements necessary to  
23 become a certificated teacher in this state.

- 1           2.    An interim reciprocal certificate granted under this section is valid for two years.  
2                The individual shall submit evidence of progress on the individual's educational  
3                plan to the education standards and practices board at the end of the two-year  
4                period. The interim reciprocal certificate may be renewed for one additional  
5                two-year period if satisfactory progress is demonstrated.

- 6           3.    Notwithstanding any other law, an interim reciprocal certificate granted under this  
7                section is the equivalent of a teaching certificate granted under chapter 15-36.

8           **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
9 created and enacted as follows:

10           **Reciprocal acceptance of teaching certificates - Report.** On or before July 1, 2001,  
11 the education standards and practices board shall implement a program for the reciprocal  
12 acceptance of teaching certificates issued by the states of Minnesota, Montana, and South  
13 Dakota. The education standards and practices board shall present a progress report  
14 regarding implementation of the program to the legislative council or to a committee designated  
15 by the council before October 1, 2000.

16           **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
