- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 11-10-10 and 11-10-10.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the salaries of elected county officers; and to provide an effective
- 3 date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 11-10-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 7 **11-10-10.** Salaries of <u>elected</u> county officers.
- 8 The salary of the an elected county auditor, county treasurer, county 1. 9 superintendent of schools, register of deeds, clerk of district court, and sheriff must 10 be regulated by the population in the respective counties according to the last 11 preceding official federal census from and after the date when the official report of 12 such the census has been published by the director of the census or such other 13 official as may be charged with the duty of making such official publication. 14 Notwithstanding any decreases in population, the salaries paid county officers as 15 of July 1, 1981, reduced by any discretionary salary increase authorized by the 16 county commissioners pursuant to this section, must be at least the minimum 17 amount payable for that office when filled on a full-time basis in the future. 18 2. The An elected county treasurer, county superintendent of schools, register of 19 deeds, county auditor, and clerk of district court each shall receive are entitled to 20 the following minimum annual salary, payable monthly, for official services 21 rendered: 22 Seventeen Nineteen thousand dollars in counties having a population of less a.
- than eight thousand.

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- 1 Seventeen Nineteen thousand five hundred dollars in counties having a b. 2 population of or exceeding eight thousand plus additional compensation of 3 one hundred dollars per year for each one thousand additional population or 4 major fraction thereof over eight thousand. However, in counties where the 5 population consists of more than twenty-five percent Indians who have not 6 severed tribal relations, the county commissioners may adjust the salaries provided for herein in this subsection within the limitations contained in this 7 8 subdivision. 9 The compensation for the clerk of a district court which is funded by the state
- pursuant to section 11-17-11 must be set by the supreme court as a part of thejudicial branch personnel system.

- 13 4. The county superintendent of schools is entitled to receive for any trips necessarily 14 made within the county in the performance of school district reorganization duties the same mileage received under section 11-10-15. The board of county 15 16 commissioners of any county may, by resolution, increase the salary of any 17 full-time county official provided in this section, if, in the judgment of such board, by 18 reason of duties performed, the official merits the increase. The salary of a county 19 official may not be reduced during the official's term of office. Any county official 20 performing duties on less than a full-time basis may be paid a reduced salary set 21 by the board of county commissioners. In the event If the county has for its 22 employees, a group insurance program for hospital benefits, medical benefits, or 23 life insurance, or a group retirement program, financed in part or entirely by the 24 county, such the benefits may be in addition to the salaries payable to county 25 officials.
- Each county commissioner may receive an annual salary or per diem as provided
 by resolution of the board, with a maximum of ten thousand dollars in counties with
 a population in excess of ten thousand and a maximum of nine thousand three
 hundred dollars in counties with a population of ten thousand or less. In addition,
 there must be an allowance for meals and lodging expenses at the same rate and
 under the same conditions as provided for state officials and employees. The

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1		allowance for travel expenses must be at the same rate as provided by section
2		11-10-15, and must be evidenced by a subvoucher or receipt as provided by
3		section 21-05-01. As used in this section, the words "official business" include
4		statewide meetings of the North Dakota county commissioners association.
5		If a board shall resolve to pay an annual salary pursuant to this subsection, it
6		must be paid in monthly installments.
7	6. <u>5.</u>	Sheriffs shall receive An elected sheriff is entitled to the following minimum annual
8		salary, payable monthly, for official services rendered:
9		a. Nineteen Twenty-one thousand nine hundred dollars in counties having a
10		population with less than eight thousand.
11		b. Twenty Twenty-two thousand nine hundred dollars in counties having a
12		population exceeding eight thousand plus additional compensation of one
13		hundred dollars per year for each one thousand additional population or major
14		fraction thereof over eight thousand. However, in counties where the
15		population consists of more than twenty-five percent Indians who have not
16		severed tribal relations, the county commissioners may adjust the salaries
17		provided for herein in this subsection within the limitations contained in this
18		subdivision.
19	7. <u>6.</u>	State's attorneys An elected state's attorney in counties having a population
20		exceeding thirty-five thousand, or in other counties where the board of county
21		commissioners has determined by resolution that the state's attorney shall must be
22		full time and shall may not be an attorney or counsel for any party except the state
23		or county, shall is entitled to receive forty-five a minimum salary of forty-seven
24		thousand dollars, but the county may increase that amount up to the same salary
25		as a county court judge. State's attorneys not considered full time shall receive
26		are entitled to an annual salary of at least forty-five percent of the minimum salary
27		paid to a full-time state's attorney.
28	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 11-10-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
29	amended a	ind reenacted as follows:
30	11-	10-10.1. Legislative intent in regard to county salaries. It is the intent of the

31 legislative assembly that the several boards of county commissioners shall exercise the

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- 1 responsibility of setting the salaries of county officials within the limits imposed by section
- 2 11-10-10. A board of county commissioners, in making a decision in regard to a county
- 3 official's salary, should take into account the financial status of the county, the responsibilities of
- 4 the position, and any other factors which that the board may deem deems relevant in arriving
- 5 at such the decision.
- 6 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on January 1, 2000.
