1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 4-14.1-03, 4-14.1-04, subsection 6 of section 2 10-30-04, subsection 4 of section 10-30.5-02, sections 10-30.5-03, 10-30.5-05, subsection 6 of 3 section 10-30.6-04, sections 21-11-02, 21-11-03, 21-11-04, 21-11-05, 21-11-06, 25-04-20, 4 subsection 4 of section 26.1-50-01, section 26.1-50-02, subsection 2 of section 28-32-01, 5 sections 40-57.1-04, 49-10.1-17, subsection 4 of section 50-06-01.8, section 52-01-03, 6 subsection 5 of section 52-02.1-01, section 52-02.1-02, subsection 2 of section 52-02.1-03, 7 section 52-02.1-04, subdivision r of subsection 1 of section 54-06-04, sections 54-34-06.1, 8 54-34-12, 54-34-15, 54-34.3-01, 54-34.3-02, 54-34.3-04, 54-34.3-06, 54-34.3-08, 54-34.3-09, 9 54-34.3-10, 54-53-02, 55-06-01, and subsection 1 of section 57-38.5-01 of the North Dakota 10 Century Code, relating to the transfer of functions of the department of economic development 11 and finance to the Bank of North Dakota; to repeal sections 54-34.3-03 and 54-34.3-05 of the 12 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the department of economic development and finance;

13 and to provide an appropriation.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4-14.1-03 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

17

4-14.1-03. Agricultural products utilization commission - Composition -

Appointment. The agricultural fuel tax fund must be administered by the agricultural products utilization commission. The commission consists of nine members, five of whom must be appointed by the governor for terms of two years each, arranged so that two terms expire in odd-numbered years and three terms expire in even-numbered years. Three members appointed by the governor must be actively engaged in farming in this state and two members appointed by the governor must be actively engaged in business in this state. The commissioner of agriculture shall appoint one member for a term of two years which expires in

1 odd-numbered years. The member appointed by the commissioner must be actively engaged 2 in farming in this state. Commission members may be reappointed to the commission. Terms 3 of commissioners shall run from the first day of July. The director of the department division of 4 economic development and finance, the president of North Dakota state university, and the 5 commissioner of agriculture, or their designees, are members of the commission. The 6 commission shall elect one of its members as chairman. 7 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-14.1-04 of the 1997 Supplement to the North 8 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 9 4-14.1-04. Agricultural products utilization commission - Meetings - Personnel -10 **Reports.** The agricultural products utilization commission, which is a division of the 11 department Bank of economic development and finance North Dakota, shall meet as 12 necessary and shall report to each session of the legislative assembly. The commission may 13 secure office space, employ needed personnel for the performance of its duties, hire 14 consultants, spend any funds appropriated to the commission, and contract with public entities 15 or private parties for services. SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 10-30-04 of the North Dakota 16 17 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 18 Cooperate with and avail itself of the facilities of the department Bank of economic 6. 19 development and finance North Dakota and any other similar governmental 20 agencies; to cooperate with and assist, and otherwise encourage, local 21 organizations in the various communities of the state the purpose of which are the 22 promotion, assistance, and development of the business prosperity and economic 23 welfare of such the communities and of this state. 24 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 10-30.5-02 of the North Dakota 25 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 26 4. The director of the department division of economic development and finance shall 27 adopt rules, subject to the approval of the board of directors, necessary to 28 implement the administration of the fund. The rules to implement the grant 29 program must be developed to encourage local fundraising initiatives for 30 developing locations for businesses financed by the corporation.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 10-30.5-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **10-30.5-03.** Organization. A board of directors shall manage the corporation. The 4 board of directors shall adopt and amend articles of incorporation and bylaws consistent with 5 the purposes detailed in this chapter. The board of directors consists of eight members who 6 shall serve three-year terms. The terms must be staggered so that no more than three 7 positions require reappointment in any one year. The governor shall appoint the members and 8 shall only consider representatives who serve in executive capacities from the following areas 9 in making the selections: private sector manufacturing, finance, exported services, including 10 tourism, and industrial technology and research. There must be at least one member who is 11 enrolled in a federally recognized North Dakota Indian tribe who need not serve in an executive 12 capacity, the director of the division of economic development and finance, and one member 13 from a rural area, on the board of directors. Members may be reappointed for additional terms.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 10-30.5-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

10-30.5-05. Management. The deputy director of the finance division of the
department must be economic development and finance shall serve as the chief executive
officer of the corporation. The board of directors shall determine minimum qualifications of all
other staff positions.

All investments, contracts, partnerships, limited liability companies, and business transactions of the corporation are the responsibility of the deputy director chief executive officer and the board of directors. The board may provide that normal operating costs anticipated in an approved budget may be incurred and paid without prior board approval. SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 10-30.6-04 of the 1997

25 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

6. Cooperate with and avail itself of the facilities of the department division of
economic development and finance and any other similar governmental agencies;
and cooperate with, assist, and otherwise encourage local organizations in the
various communities of the state, the purpose of which are is the promotion,
assistance, and development of the business prosperity and economic welfare of
the communities and of this state.

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SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 21-11-02 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

3 21-11-02. Application for loan - Form - Contents - Preference of applications. Any 4 privately or cooperatively owned enterprise for the purpose of securing a loan from this state for 5 purposes of planning, constructing, acquiring, equipping, improving, or extending facilities for 6 the conversion of North Dakota's natural resources into low cost power and the generation and 7 transmission of such power, and the acquisition of real and personal property and water and 8 mineral rights needed for such facilities, or any of such purposes, may file an application with 9 the department Bank of economic development and finance North Dakota. The application 10 must be in the form required by the department Bank and must be accompanied by a complete 11 and fully detailed outline and description of the applicant's plan of operation. In the 12 consideration of applications the department shall consider the following factors: 13 Preference must be given to applicants with the following gualifications: 1. 14 Applicants who are experienced in the generation or transmission of power, a. 15 and who at the time of application have access to alternate markets for the 16 sale of such power. 17 Applicants who are residents of North Dakota, or private or cooperative b. 18 enterprises incorporated under the laws of North Dakota and having their 19 headquarters in the state, whether or not a nonresident person, corporation, 20 or limited liability company owns part or all of the stock of the applicant or 21 limited liability companies organized under the laws of North Dakota and 22 having their headquarters in the state, whether or not a nonresident person, 23 limited liability company, or corporation owns part or all of the membership 24 interests of the applicant, or is engaged in a partnership or joint enterprise 25 with the applicant. 26 2. The provisions of subsection Subsection 1 do does not prohibit the department 27 Bank from approving loans to applicants not possessing the qualifications therein

- 30 3. Each application shall <u>must</u> include information for the purpose of showing to the

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- 1a.That the facilities proposed to be financed by the loan will result in significant2additional industrial or other economic activity in North Dakota which would3not occur in the absence of a state loan.
- b. That the cost of power furnished by the facilities financed by the loan will be
 significantly lower than it would be without a loan made under this chapter.
- c. That the facilities financed will furnish power at the lowest possible cost to
 stimulate industrial development, benefit the general public, and expand the
 use of North Dakota fuel resources.
- 9 4. In considering applications the department <u>Bank</u> may establish additional
 10 reasonable criteria with respect to the financial qualification of individuals and
 11 organizations requesting loans.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 21-11-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 21-11-03. Processing of application - Fee - Purpose. The department Bank of 15 economic development and finance North Dakota shall process each application and if it 16 determines the applicant is eligible for the loan and has complied with all requirements, it shall 17 request an application fee of not more than fifty thousand dollars. The fee must be deposited in 18 a special and separate fund in the state treasury and must be expended by the department 19 Bank for purposes of investigating the applicant and evaluating the technical and economic 20 feasibility of the plans and specifications as submitted by the applicant. The department Bank 21 may consult or contract with any person or private, state, or federal department, agency, or 22 entity, for purposes of that investigation or evaluation. All departments, agencies, institutions, 23 and officials of this state and its political subdivisions shall provide to the department Bank such 24 aid, information, and assistance as it may request in regard to any matter relative to the 25 applicant or such the applicant's plans and specifications. The department Bank may conduct 26 any private or public hearing it may deem necessary in the course of that investigation or 27 evaluation. Any unexpended portion of the funds received as an application fee must be 28 refunded to the applicant after the payment of all costs of investigation and evaluation of the 29 application. There is hereby appropriated from each application fee these funds as may be 30 necessary to pay all costs of investigation and evaluation and pay refunds as provided in this 31 section.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 21-11-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

21-11-04. Approval or rejection of application. Upon completion of all investigations and evaluations of any matter relative to the applicant or the submitted application and plan, the department Bank of economic development and finance North Dakota shall either reject the application as submitted, approve the application as submitted, or offer to approve the application if modified in accordance with any recommendation made by the commission Bank as a result of any such the investigation or evaluation. If the applicant fails or refuses to agree to those modifications, the application must be rejected.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 21-11-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

12 **21-11-05.** Approved application filed with industrial commission. Upon approval 13 of the application, as submitted or modified, the department Bank of economic development 14 and finance North Dakota shall file the application, along with its report and recommendations, 15 received by it as a result of any investigation and evaluation, with the state industrial 16 commission. The department of economic development and finance Bank shall prepare and 17 submit any necessary legislation for the appropriation of additional funds or the authorization of 18 the issuance of bonds at the following session of the legislative assembly, or at a special 19 session if called in accordance with the constitution.

20 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 21-11-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows:

22 **21-11-06.** Disbursements of loan - Inspection fee. If the industrial commission finds 23 that the approved loan application has been filed and processed as required by this chapter 24 and the proposed loan agreement is in proper legal form and the amount to be disbursed 25 thereunder, with other previous disbursements, does not exceed the funds appropriated for that 26 purpose, it shall authorize the execution of the loan agreement with the applicant by the 27 director president of the department Bank of economic development and finance North Dakota 28 on behalf of the state. Prior to the Before disbursement of any funds pursuant to the loan 29 agreement, the applicant shall deliver to the director Bank a supervision fee in such the amount 30 as may be specified in the loan agreement, which fee must be deposited in a special fund in the 31 state treasury. The fee must be expended by the department of economic development and

1 finance Bank for the purpose of periodic inspection of the construction of such the power 2 generation or transmission facilities, and disbursements to the borrower under the loan 3 agreement may be made only upon certification by the director or a person appointed by the 4 director Bank that the construction is being carried on in accordance with the loan agreement 5 and that the loan funds are due the borrower under the agreement. Upon the completion of the 6 construction of the facilities, any unexpended balance of the inspection fee must be refunded to 7 the borrower. There is hereby appropriated from each inspection fee those funds as may be 8 necessary to provide for the inspections and refunds as provided in this section.

9 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 25-04-20 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
10 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

11 25-04-20. Westwood park assets management committee. The westwood park 12 assets management committee consists of eleven members appointed by the governor as 13 follows: three members of the senate, two from the majority faction and one from the minority 14 faction, and three members of the house of representatives, two from the majority faction and 15 one from the minority faction; a representative of the department of human services; a 16 representative of the department division of economic development and finance; a 17 representative of the attorney general's office; the mayor of Grafton; and the governor or the 18 governor's designee. The governor shall appoint a chairman. Any state agency may serve in 19 an advisory capacity to the westwood park assets management committee at the discretion of 20 the committee. The committee shall meet at such times as the committee or its chairman may 21 direct. The legislative members of the committee are entitled to receive the same 22 compensation per day as established for members of the legislative assembly for attendance at 23 interim committee meetings and the necessary mileage and travel expenses provided in 24 sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09 while attending committee meetings or in the performance of 25 such special duties as the committee may direct. The compensation provided for in this section 26 may not be paid to any member of the committee who received salary or other compensation 27 as a regular employee of the state, or any of its political subdivisions, or any institution or 28 industry operated by the state. The westwood park assets management committee shall act 29 when the legislative assembly is not in session to sell the property of westwood park, subject to 30 prior budget section approval. The department of human services shall provide staff services

for the westwood park assets committee. Any conveyance made by the committee under this
 section is exempt from sections 54-01-05.2 and 54-01-05.5.

3 SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 26.1-50-01 of the 1997
4 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4. "Primary sector business" means an individual, corporation, limited liability
company, partnership, or association that through the employment of knowledge or
labor adds value to a product, process, or service which results in the creation of
new wealth. Qualification as a primary sector business under this subsection must
be determined by the department division of economic development and finance.

SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 26.1-50-02 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

12 **26.1-50-02.** Establishment - Organization. Any insurer or group of insurers may 13 establish a corporation or limited liability company to own and operate the North Dakota 14 low-risk incentive fund. Except as provided in this chapter, all authority regarding the articles of 15 incorporation or articles of organization is the province of the governing board, which must 16 include a representative of the Bank of North Dakota and the director of the department of 17 economic development and finance. The Bank of North Dakota shall administer the fund; 18 however, the governing board is responsible for adopting fund policies and procedures. The 19 governing board may not distribute more than seventy-five percent of the net profit of the fund 20 in any of the first five years of operation.

SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 28-32-01 of the 1997
 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

2. "Administrative agency" or "agency" means each board, bureau, commission,
department, or other administrative unit of the executive branch of state
government, including one or more officers, or employees, or other persons
directly or indirectly purporting to act on behalf or under authority of the agency.
An administrative unit located within or subordinate to an administrative agency
shall be treated as part of that agency to the extent it purports to exercise authority
subject to this chapter. The term administrative agency does not include:

8 SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 40-57.1-04 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
9 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

10 40-57.1-04. Exemption from income tax - Notice to competitors - Limitations. 11 Upon application by a project operator to the state board of equalization, the net income of a 12 project may be exempt from state income tax for a period not exceeding five years from 13 commencement of project operations. The application for the exemption must be reviewed as 14 to the eligibility of the project by the department division of economic development and finance 15 and its recommendations forwarded to the state board of equalization. The project operator 16 shall provide notice to competitors in the manner prescribed by the state board of equalization. 17 The board shall determine whether the granting of the exemption is in the best interest of the 18 people of North Dakota and, if it so determines, approve the exemption. The board shall, after 19 making its determination, certify the findings back to the applicant and to the tax commissioner. 20 Nothing contained herein shall have the effect of exempting exempts the project from filing an 21 annual income tax return.

SECTION 18. AMENDMENT. Section 49-10.1-17 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

49-10.1-17. Agreements to restore Amtrak service. The governor or the director of the department of transportation may make agreements in accordance with applicable federal law with the state of Montana and relevant federal agencies for the renewal of service on the Amtrak north coast Hiawatha route from Fargo to Spokane, Washington. The governor, or the director of the department of transportation, or the director of the department <u>division</u> of economic development and finance may enter agreements with any political subdivision, state, and federal agency for the restoration of daily service on the Amtrak Empire Builder route.

SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 50-06-01.8 of the 1997
 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4. The department division of economic development and finance, job service North
Dakota, county social service boards, and any other state agency determined
appropriate, shall cooperate with the department to ensure the success of the
program. Local government agencies are encouraged to cooperate with the
department.

8 SECTION 20. AMENDMENT. Section 52-01-03 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
9 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **52-01-03.** Disclosure of information. Except as otherwise provided in this section, 11 information obtained from any employing unit or individual pursuant to the administration of the 12 North Dakota Unemployment Compensation Law and determinations as to the benefit rights of 13 any individual must be held confidential and may not be disclosed or be open to public 14 inspection in any manner revealing the individual's or employing unit's identity. Any claimant or 15 claimant's legal representative must be supplied with information from the records of the job 16 insurance division, to the extent necessary for the proper presentation of the claimant's claim in 17 any proceeding under the North Dakota Unemployment Compensation Law with respect to the 18 claim. Subject to restrictions as the bureau by rule may prescribe, the information may be 19 made available to any agency of this or any other state, or any federal agency, charged with 20 the administration of any unemployment compensation law or the maintenance of a system of 21 public employment offices, or the bureau of internal revenue of the United States department of 22 the treasury, and information obtained in connection with the administration of the employment 23 service may be made available to persons or agencies for purposes appropriate to the 24 operation of a public employment service. Upon a request, the bureau shall furnish to any 25 agency of the United States charged with the administration of public works or assistance 26 through public employment, and may furnish to any state agency similarly charged, the name, 27 address, ordinary occupation, and employment status of each recipient of benefits and the 28 recipient's rights to further benefits under the North Dakota Unemployment Compensation Law. 29 The bureau may request the comptroller of the currency of the United States to cause an 30 examination of the correctness of any return or report of any national banking association, 31 rendered pursuant to the North Dakota Unemployment Compensation Law, and in connection

1 with the request, may transmit any report or return to the comptroller of the currency of the 2 United States as provided in subsection c of section 3305 of the federal Internal Revenue 3 Code. The bureau shall request and exchange information for purposes of income and 4 eligibility verification to meet the requirements of section 1137 of the Social Security Act. 5 The bureau may provide the workers compensation bureau, the state commissioner of 6 labor, the department division of economic development and finance, the state tax 7 commissioner, and the North Dakota occupational information coordinating committee with 8 information obtained pursuant to the administration of the North Dakota Unemployment 9 Compensation Law. Any information so provided may be used only for the purpose of 10 administering the duties of the workers compensation bureau, the state commissioner of labor, 11 the state department division of economic development and finance, the state tax 12 commissioner, and the North Dakota occupational information coordinating committee. The 13 bureau may provide any state agency or a private entity with the names and addresses of 14 employing units for the purpose of jointly publishing or distributing publications or other 15 information as provided in section 54-06-04.3. Any information so provided may only be used 16 for the purpose of jointly publishing or distributing publications or other information as provided 17 in section 54-06-04.3. 18 Whenever the bureau obtains information on the activities of a contractor doing 19 business in this state of which officials of the secretary of state, workers compensation bureau, 20 or the tax commissioner may be unaware and that may be relevant to duties of those officials, 21 the bureau shall provide any relevant information to those officials for the purpose of 22 administering their duties. 23 The bureau shall request and exchange information as required of the bureau under 24 federal law with any specified governmental agencies. Any information so provided may be 25 used only for the purpose of administering the duties of such governmental agencies. 26 SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Subsection 5 of section 52-02.1-01 of the 1997 27 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 28 5. "Department Division" means the department division of economic development 29 and finance.

30 SECTION 22. AMENDMENT. Section 52-02.1-02 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
31 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

8		derived from new jobs resulting from the project.

10	4.	Provides that any deferral of program cost payments may not exceed ten years
11		from the date of commencement of the project.
12	5.	Provides that on-the-job training costs for employees may not exceed fifty percent
13		of the annual gross payroll costs of the new jobs in the first full year after the date
14		of commencement of the project. For purposes of this subsection, "gross payroll"
15		is the gross wages and salaries for the new jobs.
16	6.	Provides the maximum amount of new jobs credit from withholding or tuition and
17		fee payments allowed for a project.
18	7.	Provides that every employee participating in the new jobs training program must
19		be paid an income of at least seven dollars and fifty cents per hour, plus benefits,
20		by the end of the first year of employment under the project and for the remaining
21		life of the loan.
22	A project re	quiring a loan from the department division or a community may not be approved,
23	and an agre	eement may not be executed by job service North Dakota, until notification from the
24	department	division or community that the employer has qualified for a loan. Upon execution of
25	the agreem	ent, job service North Dakota shall notify the state tax commissioner of the
26	agreement	and the identity of the employer. Job service North Dakota may adopt rules to
27	implement	this chapter. Job service North Dakota shall prepare an annual report for the
28	governor ar	nd the legislative assembly with respect to the new jobs training program.
29	SEC	CTION 23. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 52-02.1-03 of the 1997
