Daily instruction time in excess of five hours and thirty minutes for elementary students and six hours for high school students may be aggregated, after a weather-related closure, to make up for up to six hours of instruction time lost during a school year because of a weather-related school closure, if the school's calendar provides for instruction time that exceeds the minimum required hours of instruction by at least fifteen minutes during each of the one hundred seventy-three full days of instruction.
