1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 12-63-01, subsection 2 of section 12-63-12,

2 and section 12-63-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to peace officer standards,

3 training, and licensing.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12-63-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **12-63-01. Definitions.** In sections 12-63-01 through 12-63-14, unless the context or
8 subject matter otherwise requires:

- 9 1. "Board" means the peace officer standards and training board.
- 10 2. "Director" means the director of the division.
- "Division" means the criminal justice training and statistics division training section
   of the bureau of criminal investigation.
- "Peace officer" means a public servant authorized by law or by government agency
   or branch to enforce the law and to conduct or engage in investigations of
   violations of the law.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 12-63-12 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

Denial, refusal to renew, suspension, revocation, or imposition of probationary
 condition on a license may be ordered by the board after a hearing in a manner
 provided by rules adopted by the board. An application for reinstatement may be
 made to the board one year from the date of <u>the refusal to renew or the</u> revocation
 of the license. The board may accept or reject an application for reinstatement and
 may hold a hearing to consider the reinstatement. In the case of a denial of an

- application, the applicant may not reapply for a period of one year from the date of
   the order of denial.
- 3 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 12-63-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
  4 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 5 **12-63-14. Penalty.** Violation of sections 12-63-01 through 12-63-14 Any person who
- 6 <u>willfully violates this chapter</u> is <u>guilty of</u> a class B misdemeanor.
