1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the extension

2 service, northern crops institute, upper great plains transportation institute, and the experiment

3 centers; to provide for dairy diagnostic teams; to provide statements of legislative intent; and to

4 amend and reenact sections 4-05.1-02, 4-05.1-04, 4-05.1-16, 4-05.1-17, 4-05.1-18, 4-05.1-19,

5 4-05.1-21, and 4-08-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state board of

6 agricultural research.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 9 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in 10 the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal 11 funds and other income to the North Dakota state university extension service, the northern 12 crops institute, the upper great plains transportation institute, and the North Dakota agricultural 13 experiment centers for the purpose of defraying the expenses of their various divisions, for the 14 biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001, as follows:

16	SECTION 2. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION.	Any additional income
17	including funds from the federal government and gifts and donations	s from private sources
18	received by the North Dakota agricultural experiment station, northe	ern crops institute, upper

19 great plains transportation institute, and the North Dakota state university extension service,

20 except as otherwise provided by law, is hereby appropriated for the purpose designated in the

21 gift, grant, or donation for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001.

SECTION 3. UNEXPENDED GENERAL FUND - EXCESS INCOME. Any unexpended
 general fund appropriation authority to and any excess income received by entities listed in
 section 1 of this Act are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and any
 unexpended funds from these appropriations or revenues are available and may be expended
 during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

SECTION 4. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The state board of higher education is
authorized to approve transfer of funds between line items for each agency included in
section 1 of this Act and shall notify the office of management and budget within ten days
following the transfer.

SECTION 5. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Upon approval of the state board of higher
 education and the state board of agricultural research and education, the director of the North
 Dakota agricultural experiment station may transfer appropriation authority from subdivision 4
 to subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act and shall notify the office of management and budget
 within ten days.

6 SECTION 6. INITIATIVES - TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Upon approval of the state 7 board of agricultural research and education, the director of the North Dakota agricultural 8 experiment station may transfer appropriation authority of up to \$227,335 from subdivision 4 to 9 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act and shall notify the office of management and budget 10 within ten days.

SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS. The board of
higher education is authorized to adjust or increase full-time equivalent positions as needed,
subject to availability of funds. The board shall report any adjustments to the office of
management and budget prior to the submission of the 2001-03 budget request.

SECTION 8. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The state board of higher education is
authorized to transfer to the entities in subdivisions 1 through 3 and subdivision 5 of section 1
of this Act from subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act up to \$422,400 to provide salary
adjustments. The state board of higher education shall notify the office of management and
budget within ten days of the transfer.

20 SECTION 9. Dairy diagnostic teams. The North Dakota state university extension 21 service shall appoint regional dairy diagnostic teams consisting of agricultural business 22 management professionals, dairy extension specialists, and dairy industry partners such as 23 nutrition specialists, reproductive specialists, and animal health specialists. At the request of a 24 dairy producer, a dairy diagnostic team shall conduct a site visit, offer the dairy producer 25 educational and technological assistance, and develop a strategic plan to enhance the 26 producer's productivity and profitability. 27 SECTION 10. ESTIMATED INCOME - MAIN RESEARCH CENTER - ENVIRONMENT

AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in subdivision 4 of
 section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$90,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary,
 from the environment and rangeland protection fund for the purpose of constructing chemical

1 handling facilities at select research centers for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and

2 ending June 30, 2001.

3 SECTION 11. ESTIMATED INCOME - TRANSPORTATION INSTITUTE -

4 **DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.** The estimated income line item in subdivision 3 of 5 section 1 of this Act includes \$188,000 of federal strategic planning and research funds from 6 the department of transportation. The director of the department of transportation may not 7 transfer the \$188,000 of federal funds until the director of the upper great plains transportation 8 institute has certified to the department of transportation that the institute has raised \$100,000 9 to supplement the federal funds available from the department of transportation for the strategic 10 freight transportation analysis for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 11 2001.

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SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT

SUPERVISOR TRAINING. It is the intent of the fifty-sixth legislative assembly that the NDSU
extension service use the funding provided for the soil conservation leadership initiative only for
providing training to soil conservation district supervisors and that the training address specific
issues and concerns of the local district supervisors for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999,
and ending June 30, 2001.

SECTION 13. STATE BOARD OF AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH AND EDUCATION
 - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. The state board of agricultural research and
 education shall report periodically to the legislative council or a committee designated by the
 council on its activities associated with researching and developing market opportunities for
 biotechnologically enhanced crops for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
 June 30, 2001.

SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-02 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-05.1-02. Agricultural experiment station. The state board of agricultural research
 and education and the president of North Dakota state university shall control and administer
 the North Dakota agricultural experiment station subject to the supervision of the state board of
 higher education. Funds appropriated to the agricultural experiment station may not be
 commingled with funds appropriated to North Dakota state university. Appropriation requests

to defray expenses of the agricultural experiment station must be separate from appropriation
 requests to defray expenses of North Dakota state university.

3 SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-04 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
4 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

5 4-05.1-04. Reports. Each center director shall submit an annual report to the station 6 director as directed by the state board of agricultural research and education. Each report must 7 set forth in detail the investigations and experiments made during the preceding year, 8 recommendations for the welfare of the center, the financial condition of the center, how all 9 moneys have been expended, and the results of experiments. The station director shall submit 10 these reports, with a report of the North Dakota state university main research center, to the 11 state board of agricultural research and education and the state board of higher education on or 12 before the first day of September of each year. If the state board of higher education submits a 13 biennial report to the governor and the secretary of state in accordance with section 54-06-04, 14 the report must include a composite of the reports from the main research center and each 15 research extension center. 16 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-16 of the 1997 Supplement to the North 17 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 18 4-05.1-16. State board of agricultural research and education - Membership -19 Terms. 20 1. The state board of agricultural research and education consists of: 21 The president of North Dakota state university; a. 22 b. The vice president of agricultural affairs at North Dakota state university; 23 The administrator of the agricultural experiment station; c. 24 d. The five persons appointed to the agricultural consultation board by the ag 25 coalition and serving in that capacity on July 1, 1997; 26 The five persons appointed to the agricultural consultation board by the e. 27 extension service's multicounty program units and serving in that capacity on 28 July 1, 1997; 29 The two persons appointed to the agricultural consultation board by the f. 30 president of North Dakota state university as representatives of the state's 31 research extension centers and serving in that capacity on July 1, 1997;

1		g.	The commissioner of agriculture, who serves in an ex officio nonvoting
2			capacity; and
3		h.	The director of the North Dakota state university extension service, who
4			serves in an ex officio capacity.
5	2.	a.	The initial five members appointed by the ag coalition shall select their terms
6			by lot so that one member serves for one year, one member serves for two
7			years, one member serves for three years, one member serves for four years,
8			and one member serves for five years.
9		b.	The initial five members appointed by the extension service's multicounty
10			program units shall select their terms by lot so that one member serves for
11			one year, one member serves for two years, one member serves for three
12			years, one member serves for four years, and one member serves for five
13			years.
14		C.	The two persons appointed as representatives of the state's research
15			extension centers shall serve only through June 30, 1998.
16	3.	At th	ne completion of each initial term, the term of office for each member is five
17		year	rs, beginning on July first. No person may be appointed to a second five-year
18		term	λ.
19	4.	a.	At least ninety days before the conclusion of the initial term of each member
20			appointed by the ag coalition, the ag coalition shall provide to the state board
21			of higher education a list of two one or more names from which the state
22			board of higher education shall appoint a successor. Future appointments to
23			these five positions must be made in the same manner. The state board of
24			higher education shall ensure that four out of the five seats are held by
25			agricultural producers.
26		b.	At least ninety days before the conclusion of the initial term of each member
27			appointed by the extension service's multicounty program units, the units
28			through their advisory groups shall provide to the state board of higher
29			education a list of two one or more names from which the state board of
30			higher education shall appoint a successor. Future appointments to these
31			five positions must be made in the same manner. The state board of higher

1 2 education shall ensure that four out of the five seats are held by agricultural producers.

3 SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-17 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
4 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **4-05.1-17. Compensation of board members - Expenses.** Each appointed member 6 of the state board of agricultural research and education is entitled to receive sixty-two dollars

7 and fifty cents per day as compensation for the time actually spent devoted to the duties of

8 office and is entitled to receive necessary expenses in the same manner and amounts as state

9 officials for attending meetings and performing other functions of office.

SECTION 18. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-18 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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4-05.1-18. State board of agricultural research and education - Chairman -

Meetings. The state board of agricultural research <u>and education</u> annually shall elect one of its members to serve as chairman. The board shall meet at the times and locations designated by the chairman in consultation with the vice president of agricultural affairs at North Dakota state university.

SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-19 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-05.1-19. State board of agricultural research <u>and education</u> - Duties. Within the
policies of the state board of higher education, the state board of agricultural research <u>and</u>
<u>education</u> is responsible for the budgeting, supervision, and policymaking responsibilities
associated with the supervision of the agricultural experiment station <u>and the North Dakota</u>
<u>state university extension service</u>. The agricultural research <u>and education</u> board shall:

- Determine the causes of any adverse economic impacts on crops and livestock
 produced in this state;
- Develop ongoing strategies for the provision of research solutions to negate
 adverse economic impacts on crops and livestock produced in this state;
- Make available financial resources, including grants and salaries, and make
 available equipment and facilities to implement the strategies developed under
 subsection 2, subject to approval by the state board of higher education;

1	4.	Develop an annual budget for the operation of the agricultural experiment station
2		and the North Dakota state university extension service;
3	5.	Develop a biennial budget request and submit that request to the state board of
4		higher education on or before March first of each even-numbered year;
5	6.	Maximize the use of existing financial resources, equipment, and facilities to
6		generate the greatest economic benefit from research and extension efforts and to
7		promote efficiency;
8	7.	Annually evaluate the results of research and extension activities and expenditures
9		and report the findings to the legislative council and the state board of higher
10		education;
11	8.	Advise the administration of North Dakota state university regarding the
12		recruitment and selection of the vice president of agricultural affairs, the extension
13		service director, and the station director; and
14	9.	Advise the director of the extension service regarding Develop ongoing strategies
15		for the dissemination of research information and the best practices for
16		management of the extension service.
17	SEC	CTION 20. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-21 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
18	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
19	4-0	5.1-21. State board of agricultural research and education - Apportionment of
20	research fi	unds.
21	1.	The state board of agricultural research and education annually shall apportion the
22		proceeds of the agricultural research fund as follows:
23		a. Seventy percent to research activities affecting North Dakota agricultural
24		commodities that account for at least two percent of the gross sales of all
25		agricultural commodities grown or produced in the state. The percentage of
26		the dollars available for each agricultural commodity under this section may
27		not exceed the percentage that the gross sales of the agricultural commodity
28		bear to the North Dakota gross sales of all agricultural commodities grown or
29		produced during the previous year, as determined by the agricultural statistics
30		service;

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b.	Eighteen percent to research activities affecting North Dakota animal
	agriculture; and

- 3 c. Twelve percent to research activities affecting new and emerging crops in
 4 North Dakota.
- 5 2. The state board of agricultural research and education shall solicit proposals for 6 research from the public and private sectors and shall appoint committees to 7 review the proposals and award the agricultural research grants on a competitive 8 basis. Each committee must consist of a majority of agricultural producers 9 selected in consultation with the agricultural commodity groups representing 10 commodities that are the subjects of the proposed research and may include 11 researchers and other individuals knowledgeable about the proposed area of 12 research. Whenever possible, the committees shall require that a grant recipient 13 commit matching funds.
- The state board of agricultural research <u>and education</u> shall develop policies
 regarding the award of research grants, including requirements for matching funds,
 cooperation with other in-state and out-of-state researchers, and coordination with
 other in-state and out-of-state proposed or ongoing research projects.
- 18 SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Section 4-08-10 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 19 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

20 4-08-10. Extension agent to submit monthly account of expenditures. The 21 extension agent shall submit monthly an accurate itemized account of all expenditures incurred 22 by the agent in the regular conduct of duties to the North Dakota state university extension 23 service for examination and audit. When charges are made by an extension agent for money 24 expended in the performance of official duties, all items of one dollar or more expended and 25 charged for must be covered by a subvoucher or receipt that must be signed by the person to 26 whom the money was paid. The subvoucher or receipt must show at what place, on what date, 27 and for what the money expended was paid. The extension agent shall forward the 28 subvouchers or receipts with the bill, claim, account, or demand against the county. When 29 charges are made for transportation expenses, they may not exceed the amounts provided by 30 section 11-10-15, and must be in itemized form showing the mileage traveled, the days when 31 and how traveled, and the purpose thereof, verified by affidavit. The account must be

- 1 transmitted and recommended for payment by the North Dakota state university extension
- 2 service which shall audit the same and which may approve or disallow any expense item
- 3 therein. The state board of agricultural research and education and the president of North
- 4 Dakota state university shall control and administer the North Dakota state university extension
- 5 service is under the control, and subject to the supervision, of the state board of higher
- 6 education. Funds appropriated to the North Dakota state university extension service may not
- 7 be commingled with funds appropriated to North Dakota state university. An appropriation
- 8 request to defray expenses of the North Dakota state university extension service must be
- 9 separate from an appropriation request to defray expenses of North Dakota state university.
