- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to registration of psychological associates; and to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-32-01, 43-32-08.1, 43-32-08.2, 43-32-09, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, 43-32-14, 43-32-16,
- 4 43-32-17, 43-32-21, 43-32-23, 43-32-24, 43-32-26, 43-32-27, 43-32-27.1, 43-32-28.1,
- 5 43-32-30, and 43-32-32 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to registration of
- 6 psychological associates by the board of psychologist examiners.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-01 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 9 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 **43-32-01. Definitions.**

1. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.

- Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation,
 interpretation, or modification of human behavior by the application of
- 14 psychological principles, methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or
- 15 eliminating symptomatic, maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing
- 16 interpersonal relationships, work and life adjustment, personal effectiveness,
- 17 behavioral health, and mental health. The term includes psychological testing and
- 18 the evaluation or assessment of personal characteristics, such as intelligence,
- 19 personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and neuropsychological functioning;
- 20 counseling, psychotherapy, and other therapeutic techniques based on
- 21 psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorder
- 22 or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as well as of the
- 23 psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability; and
- 24 psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term

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1		includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups, and the	
2		public regardless of whether payment is received for services rendered.	
3	3.	"Psychological associate" means an individual registered under this chapter to	
4		practice psychology under the supervision of a psychologist. A psychological	
5		associate may practice psychology in the employ of any federal, state, county, or	
6		municipal agency or a nonprofit agency under contract with any federal, state,	
7		county, or municipal agency, insofar as the activities and services of the person	
8		are a part of the duties of the person's office or position with such agency or are	
9		related to the contract with that agency. A psychological associate may only	
10		practice psychology under the supervision of a licensed psychologist and pursuant	
11		to rules adopted by the board.	
12	<u>4.</u>	"Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the	
13		practice of psychology.	
14	4. <u>5.</u>	"Psychology resident" means an individual who has received from an accredited	
15		school or college a doctorate degree in a program of study substantially	
16		psychological in nature, and who is involved in supervised psychological	
17		employment.	
18	5. <u>6.</u>	"School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning that	
19		is accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate	
20		course of study in psychology.	
21	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the 1997 Supplement to the North	
22	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
23	43-3	32-08.1. Continuing education requirements. The board shall adopt rules	
24	establishing	g requirements for the continuing education of psychologists and psychological	
25	associates.	The board may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status	
26	any license or registration issued under this chapter if the licensee or registrant fails to meet		
27	applicable continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditation of continuing		
28	education c	courses, classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the	
29	board.		
30	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.2 of the 1997 Supplement to the North	
31	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	

1 43-32-08.2. Continuing education requirements - Renewal. Absent a showing of 2 good cause, the board may not renew a license or registration issued under this chapter 3 without proof the continuing education requirements established by rule of the board have been 4 met. A person whose license or registration is not renewed because of failure to meet the 5 continuing education requirements must be reinstated and the license or registration renewed 6 if, within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the person demonstrates to the secretary of the 7 board the continuing education requirements have been satisfied and pays the renewal fee and 8 a late fee to be determined by rule of the board.

9 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-09. Examination of qualifications of applicants. The board shall examine for,
deny, approve, revoke, suspend, and renew the licensing <u>or registration</u> of applicants as
provided under this chapter.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-12. Application and license or registration fee. The application fee for
licensing or registration by written and oral examination and by reciprocity must be determined
by regulation of the board. No fee is refundable in whole or in part except for failure of the
board to hold examinations at the time originally announced, in which event the entire fee must
be refunded upon demand by the applicant.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23 **43-32-13.** Annual license or registration and fee. Before January first of each year, 24 every licensed psychologist and registered psychological associate in the state shall pay to the 25 secretary of the board an annual license or registration fee determined by the board not to 26 exceed one hundred dollars. The secretary of the board, upon payment of the annual license 27 or registration fee by a person licensed or registered under this chapter, shall issue a certificate 28 of annual license or registration. A person may not hold oneself out as a licensed psychologist 29 or registered psychological associate until the annual license or registration fee is paid. The 30 board shall revoke may deny renewal of the license or registration of a person who violates this

1	section. An	nually, the board shall mail a renewal notice to all licensed psychologists and
2	registered p	sychological associates at the address on file with the board.
3	SEC	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-14 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
4	Dakota Cer	tury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
5	43-3	2-14. Payment of delinquent license or registration fees - Reinstatement. A
6	person who	has been a licensed psychologist or registered psychological associate in this state
7	under this c	hapter and whose license or registration has been revoked for failure to pay the
8	annual licer	nse or registration fee must be reinstated and the license or registration renewed if
9	within one y	rear from the date of revocation the person pays to the secretary of the board the
10	amount of the annual license or registration fees in default and a late fee in the amount of	
11	twenty dolla	Irs.
12	SEC	CTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-16 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
13	Dakota Cer	tury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
14	43-3	2-16. Board to keep records.
15	1.	The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a register of all applicants for
16		licensing or registration which must show:
17		a. The name, age, and residence of each applicant.
18		b. The date of each applicant's application.
19		c. The place of business of each applicant.
20		d. A summary of the educational and other qualifications of each applicant.
21		e. Whether an examination was required of an applicant.
22		f. Whether a license or registration was granted to an applicant.
23		g. The date of the action of the board.
24		h. Any information the board determines necessary or advisable in aid of the
25		requirements of this subsection.
26	2.	Except as otherwise provided by law, the records of the board are public records
27		and evidence of the proceedings of the board, and a transcript of board
28		proceedings, duly certified by the secretary of the board, bearing the seal of the
29		board, is admissible in evidence with the same effect as if the original were
30		produced.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 43-32-17. License or registration required for practice. Except as otherwise 4 provided by this chapter, no individual may engage in the practice of psychology or represent 5 that individual to be a psychologist in this state after August 1, 1993, unless that individual has 6 obtained from the board a license or registration to do so under this chapter. An individual 7 registered as a psychological associate may only engage in the practice of psychology in 8 association with a licensed psychologist and in accordance with rules adopted by the board. 9 An individual may not use the title psychologist or represent the individual to be a psychologist unless licensed by the board. An individual may not use the title psychological associate or 10 11 represent that the individual is a psychological associate unless the individual is registered by 12 the board. 13 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-21 of the 1997 Supplement to the North 14 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 15 43-32-21. Consideration of application and notice to applicant. Upon investigation 16 of the application and other evidence submitted, the board, not less than thirty days before the 17 examination, shall notify each applicant that the application and evidence submitted for 18 licensing or registration is satisfactory and accepted, or unsatisfactory and rejected. If rejected, 19 the notice must state the reasons for rejection and explain the right to a hearing under chapter 20 28-32, if a hearing is requested within thirty days.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

23 **43-32-23.** Scope and grading of examination. The board shall determine the subject 24 and scope of specialized psychological areas and techniques for examination. Written 25 examinations may be supplemented by such oral examinations as the board may determine. 26 The board shall determine an acceptable level of performance for each examination and a 27 majority decision of the board is required for the issuing of a license or registration. To ensure 28 impartiality, the written examination must be identified by numbers and no paper may be 29 marked in the name of any applicant, but must be anonymously graded by the board. 30 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is 31 amended and reenacted as follows:

10	have a serial nu	mber and be signed by the president of the board and attested by the secretary
11	under the board	's adopted seal. The license <u>or registration</u> issued by the board under the
12	provisions of this	s chapter must be prominently displayed at the principal place of business
13	where the psych	nologist or psychological associate practices.

8		e.	Has allowed the psychologist's name or license or registration issued under
9			this chapter to be used in connection with any person who performs
10			psychological services outside of the area of that person's training,
11			experience, or competence.
12		f.	Is legally adjudicated insane or mentally incompetent. The record of the
13			adjudication is conclusive evidence of that fact.
14		g.	Has engaged in any form of unethical conduct as defined in "Ethical
15			Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct" as adopted and published
16			by the American psychological association, 1992, or revised editions if
17			adopted by the board by rule.
18		h.	Has become grossly negligent in the practice of the profession.
19		i.	Has willfully or negligently violated this chapter.
20		j.	Has engaged in an act in violation of rules adopted by the board.

- The board may investigate a complaint on its own motion, without requiring the
 identity of the complainant to be made a matter of public record, if the board
 concludes that good cause exists for preserving the confidentiality of the
 complainant.
- 3. A psychologist or psychological associate who is the subject of an investigation by
 the board shall cooperate fully with the investigation. Cooperation includes
 responding fully and promptly to any reasonable question raised by or on behalf of
 the board relating to the subject of the investigation, and providing copies of
 patient records when reasonably requested by the board and accompanied by the
 appropriate release.
- 11 4. In order to pursue an investigation, the board may subpoena and examine 12 witnesses and records, including patient records, and copy, photograph, or take 13 samples. The board may require the licensed psychologist or registered 14 psychological associate to give statements under oath, to submit to a physical or 15 psychological examination, or both, by a physician or other qualified evaluation 16 professional selected by the board, if requiring an examination is in the best 17 interest of the public. The patient records released to the board are not public 18 records.
- 5. Unless a patient release is on file allowing the release of information at the public
 hearing, patient records acquired by the board in its investigation are confidential
 and closed to the public. All board meetings at which patient testimony or records
 are taken or reviewed are confidential and closed to the public. If no patient
 testimony or records are taken or reviewed, the remainder of the meeting is an
 open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise applicable.

25 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-28.1 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 26 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-28.1. Hearing. All hearings must be conducted pursuant to chapter 28-32. For
purposes of a hearing, the licensee, registrant, or applicant is the sole party in interest under
section 28-32-08 and section 28-32-05 applies only to the licensee, registrant, or applicant.

30 SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 31 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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1	43-3	32-30. Persons exempt from this chapter. This chapter does not apply to:
2	1.	Any person in the employ of any federal, state, county or municipal agency, or
3		other political subdivision, or any nonprofit corporation or educational institution
4		presently chartered by this state, insofar as the activities and services of the
5		person are a part of the duties of the person's office or position with such agency,
6		nonprofit corporation, or institution. This exemption is not available or effective
7		after July 1, 1999. However, the exemption period may be extended by the board
8		in individual cases where hardship or other good cause is shown by the agency,
9		nonprofit corporation, or institution covered, or where the person affected has
10		received from a school or college a master's degree in psychology and the
11		person's activities and services with such agency, nonprofit corporation, or
12		institution are performed under the supervision of a licensed psychologist. After
13		reviewing the exemption under this subsection, the board and the department of
14		human services shall review their definitions and rules for a master's degree in
15		psychology as used in their own credential requirements.
16	2.	A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology at a school or college,
17		if the activities and services are a part of the person's supervised course of study,
18		provided the student or intern does not use the title "psychologist" and the student
19		or intern status is clearly stated.
20	3. <u>2.</u>	A nonresident licensed or certified in the state of the person's residence who does
21		not practice psychology in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any
22		calendar year.
23	4. <u>3.</u>	A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title
24		when lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not
25		engage in the practice of psychology unless the lecturer is licensed to practice
26		psychology in this state.
27	5. <u>4.</u>	A person employed by a public school and whose activities and services are
28		restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment.
29		This exemption applies only when the person has received a master's degree in
30		school psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must

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1		be established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public
2		instruction.
3	6. <u>5.</u>	A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
4		profession, whose scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of
5		that person's profession, and who does not represent to be rendering
6		psychological services.
7	7. <u>6.</u>	An applicant licensed to practice psychology in another jurisdiction, pending
8		disposition of the applicant's application, if the applicant notifies the board on a
9		form provided by the board of the applicant's intent to practice pending disposition
10		of the application and the applicant adheres to the requirements of this chapter
11		and the rules adopted by the board.
12	8. <u>7.</u>	A person employed by an agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution who is
13		currently exempt from licensure continues to be exempt until July 1, 2000, if the
14		person continues employment in the same position with the agency, nonprofit
15		corporation, or institution that applied for and received the exemption.
16	9. <u>8.</u>	A psychologist psychology resident performing services supervised as provided
17		under section 43-32-20.1.
18	SEC	CTION 18. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	amended and reenacted as follows:	
20	43-3	32-32. Drugs - Medicine. Nothing in this chapter may be construed as permitting
21	psychologi	sts individuals licensed or registered under this chapter to administer or prescribe
22	drugs, or in	any manner engage in the practice of medicine as defined by the laws of this state.
23	SEC	CTION 19. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24	created and	d enacted as follows:
25	Reg	gistration - Qualifications of applicants. The board shall register as a
26	psychologia	cal associate each applicant who files an application upon a form and in a manner

27 the board prescribes, submits the required fee, and demonstrates to the board that the

9	for registrat	ion as a psychological associate is excused from the education and examination
10	requirements upon satisfactory proof to the board that the applicant is, and has been, engaged	
11	in the pract	ice of psychology pursuant to subsection 1 of section 43-32-30.
