- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the continuation of an agricultural pesticide and pesticide
- 2 container disposal program; and to provide an expiration date.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 SECTION 1. Pesticide and pesticide container disposal program - Pesticide

5 container management - Compensation.

- 6 1. The definitions contained in section 4-35-05 apply to this section.
- In consultation with an advisory board consisting of the state health officer, director
 of the North Dakota state university extension service, two individuals representing
 agribusiness organizations, and two individuals representing farm organizations, all
 of whom must be selected by the commissioner of agriculture, the commissioner of
 agriculture shall continue to implement the project authorized by section 1 of
 chapter 74 of the 1997 Session Laws, which is known as project safe send. The
 purpose of the project is to:
- 14a.Collect and either recycle or dispose of unusable pesticides and unusable15pesticide containers. The commissioner shall provide for the establishment16and operation of temporary collection sites for the pesticides and pesticide17containers. The commissioner may limit the type and quantity of pesticides18and pesticide containers acceptable for collection.
- 19b.Promote proper pesticide container management. In consultation with the20director of the North Dakota state university extension service, the21commissioner shall evaluate and promote proper methods of pesticide22container management, including information on the variety of pesticide23containers available.

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- Any entity collecting pesticide containers or unusable pesticides shall manage and
 dispose of the containers and pesticides in compliance with applicable federal and
 state requirements. When called upon, any state agency shall assist the
 commissioner in implementing the project.
- 5 4. For services rendered in connection with the design and implementation of this 6 project, the members selected by the commissioner of agriculture are entitled to 7 reimbursement for mileage and travel expenses in the same manner and for the 8 same amounts provided for state employees and officials. Compensation and 9 expense reimbursement must be paid from the environment and rangeland 10 protection fund.

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SECTION 2. PROJECT SCOPE AND EVALUATION - PROPOSED LEGISLATION.

12 The project described in section 1 of this Act must occur in areas to be determined by the 13 commissioner of agriculture in consultation with the advisory board under subsection 2 of 14 section 1 of this Act. Before December 12, 2000, the commissioner of agriculture shall determine whether the project implemented and continued under section 1 of this Act should be 15 16 continued. If the commissioner determines that the project should be continued or expanded, 17 the commissioner shall introduce appropriate legislation in the fifty-seventh legislative 18 assembly. 19 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 2001, and

20 after that date is ineffective.
