SENATE BILL NO. 2126 (Senators Thane, DeMers, Kilzer) (Representatives Price, Rose) (At the request of the State Department of Health)

AN ACT to amend and reenact subsections 1 and 3 of section 23-07-17.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to diseases for which inoculations are required before a child's admission to school.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsections 1 and 3 of section 23-07-17.1 of the 1997 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:

- 1. No <u>A</u> child may <u>not</u> be admitted to any public, private, or parochial school, or day care center, child care facility, headstart program, or nursery school operating in <u>North-Dakota this state</u> or be supervised through home-based instruction unless such <u>the</u> child's parent or guardian presents to the institution authorities a certification from a licensed physician or authorized representative of the state department of health that such <u>the</u> child has received immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, measles, rubella (German measles), mumps, and <u>hepatitis B</u>, <u>haemophilus influenza type b</u> (Hib), <u>and</u> poliomyelitis. In the case of a child receiving home-based instruction, the child's parent or legal guardian shall file the certification with the superintendent of public instruction <u>public school district in which the child resides</u>.
- 3. Any minor child, through the child's parent or guardian, may submit to the institution authorities either a certificate from a licensed physician stating that the physical condition of the child is such that immunization would endanger the life or health of the child or a certificate signed by the child's parent or guardian whose <u>religious</u>, <u>philosophical</u>, <u>or moral</u> beliefs are opposed to such immunization. The minor child is then exempt from the provisions of this section.
