- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-44.8-01, 54-44.8-03, and 54-44.8-06 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to administration of the program for telecommunications
- 3 services for communications impaired persons.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-44.8-01 of the 1997 Supplement to the North 6 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-44.8-01. Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
requires:
1. "Administrator" means the individual employed by the division to oversee

- 12 3. "Communications impaired" means the condition of an individual who is deaf,
- hearing impaired, or speech impaired, or mobility impaired so as to be unable to
 use a telephone readily purchased from a retail store.
- 15 4. <u>"Disadvantaged" means residing in a household that has a median income not</u>
 16 more than the applicable median income in this state, except the term includes
- residing in a household that has a median income not more than one hundred fifty
 percent of the applicable median income in this state if the resident is deaf.
- 19 <u>5.</u> "Division" means the information services division of the office of management and
 20 budget.
- 5. <u>6.</u> "Local exchange company" means a telecommunications company that provides
 telephone access lines to members of the general public who are its customers.
- 23 6. <u>7.</u> "Program" means the program established under section 54-44.8-03.

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1	7. <u>8.</u>	"Radio communications access" means the radio access between a customer of a
2		radio communications service provider and the provider.
3	8. <u>9.</u>	"Radio communications service provider" means a telecommunications company
4		that provides radio communication service or cellular service to members of the
5		general public who are its customers.
6	9. <u>10.</u>	"Specialized telecommunications equipment" means a device that, when
7		connected to a telephone, enables or assists a person who is communications
8		impaired to communicate with another person utilizing the telephone network. The
9		term may include telecommunications devices for the deaf, amplifiers, and
10		signaling devices.
11	10. <u>11.</u>	"Telecommunications relay service" means a statewide service through which a
12		communications-impaired individual, using specialized telecommunications
13		equipment, may send and receive messages to and from a
14		noncommunications-impaired individual whose telephone is not equipped with
15		specialized telecommunications equipment and through which a
16		noncommunications-impaired individual, by using voice communication, may send
17		and receive messages to and from a communications-impaired individual.
18	11. <u>12.</u>	"Telephone access line" means the facilities between a serving central office and
19		the customer of a local exchange company which are required to provide access to
20		the local and toll network.
21	SE	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.8-03 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
22	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
23	54-	44.8-03. Program established - Purpose.
24	1.	The division shall establish and administer a program to provide
25		telecommunications relay service to persons who are communications impaired.
26	2.	The program shall provide a telecommunications relay service to allow persons
27		who are communications impaired to communicate via the telecommunications
28		network with noncommunications-impaired persons.
29	3.	The vocational rehabilitation division of the department of human services shall
30		furnish specialized telecommunications equipment to meet the needs of individuals
31		who are communications impaired and who might be otherwise disadvantaged in

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1	their ability to obtain such equipment. The vocational rehabilitation division	
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2	department shall determine eligibility and may provide the specialized	
3	telecommunications equipment to individuals determined eligible within the limits of	
4	funding made available to the vocational rehabilitation division department through	
5	gifts and grants received under section 54-44.8-06 and from funding made	
6	available by the information services division from the surcharge collected	
7	pursuant to section 54-44.8-08, which are hereby appropriated.	
8	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.8-06 of the 1997 Supplement to the North	
9	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
10	54-44.8-06. Gifts and grants. The vocational rehabilitation division department of	
11	human services may accept contributions and gifts and may apply for and accept grants, in	
12	money or otherwise, to the program. Monetary contributions, gifts, and grants must be	
13	deposited in the state treasury to be credited to the department of human services operating	
14	account.
