## SENATE BILL NO. 2183

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 16.1-11.1 and a new
- 2 subdivision to subsection 2 of section 28-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 3 special statewide elections being conducted by mail, agents receiving mail ballots on behalf of
- 4 electors, and casting ballots by mail; and to amend and reenact sections 16.1-11.1-01,
- 5 16.1-11.1-02, 16.1-11.1-04, and 16.1-11.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 6 mail ballot elections for general and special elections and mail ballot procedures.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-11.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code
- 9 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 16.1-11.1-01. Counties may conduct mail ballot elections Polling places -
- 11 **Records.** The board of county commissioners of a county may conduct a primary election,
- 12 <u>general, and special elections</u> by mail ballot. The mail ballot election must include city elections
- 13 administered by the county auditor and may include any other election administered by the
- 14 county auditor pursuant to an agreement with the governing body of a political subdivision
- 15 within the county. The board shall may designate at least one polling place in the county to be
- 16 open on the day of the election for voting in the usual manner. The county auditor shall place a
- 17 notice at all polling places in the county used at the last statewide election which states the
- 18 location of the polling places open for the primary election. The county auditor shall keep a
- 19 record of each mail ballot provided to and returned by qualified electors and provide to the
- 20 election board at each polling place open on the day of the election a list of every person who
- 21 applied for and returned a mail ballot.
- 22 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 16.1-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 23 created and enacted as follows:

1	Special statewide elections may be conducted by mail. Special statewide elections
2	called by the governor according to this title may be conducted pursuant to the mail ballot
3	election procedures established by this chapter. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
4	secretary of state may adopt rules relating to any special statewide elections called by the
5	governor according to this title, including rules providing for the reduction of poll workers,
6	reduction of poll hours, reduction of precincts, arrangement of names of candidates on the
7	official ballot, publication of the sample ballot, and open voting within cities or counties.
8	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code
9	is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	16.1-11.1-02. Application for mail ballots. The county auditor shall mail an
11	application form for a mail ballot to each person listed in the pollbooks of the county from the
12	last regular most recent statewide general election en ene date, or in any other more reliable,
13	comprehensive, and nonpartisan sources available to the county auditor providing a more
14	accurate listing of the qualified electors of the county, no sooner than the forty-fifth fortieth day
15	before the election and no later than the thirtieth day before the election. The county auditor
16	shall take precautions to ensure that applications are mailed to the most current addresses of
17	those persons listed in the pollbooks or in the other reliable and comprehensive sources chosen
18	and may utilize private vendors to achieve that end. The county auditor may also choose to
19	mail additional applications to qualified persons not listed in the pollbooks or in the other reliable
20	sources chosen. Applications that fail to be delivered and are returned to the county auditor are
21	not required to be mailed a second time. The county auditor, for two consecutive weeks after
22	the date on which the mail ballot applications are mailed, shall publish in the official newspaper
23	of the county an application form for a mail ballot and a notice that additional mail ballot
24	applications may be obtained from the election official. The application form for a mail ballot
25	must be in substantially the following form:
26	I,, am or will be a duly qualified elector and to my best
27	(please print name)
28	knowledge and belief am or will be entitled to vote at the primary election. I hereby
29	apply for an official mail ballot to be voted by me at that election. I understand that it is
30	a criminal offense to knowingly vote when not qualified to do so.

15	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Cod	et
16	is amended and reenacted as follows:	
17	16.1-11.1-04. Voting by electors. Upon receipt of a mail ballot, an elector shall ma	ırk
18	it, sign the return identification envelope, and comply with the instructions provided with the	
19	ballot. The elector may return the completed ballot to the county auditor by mail or, before s	ix
20	p.m. on the day of the election, to any other place of deposit designated by the auditor. If the	е
21	elector returns the ballot by mail, the elector shall provide the postage, and the ballot must be	е
22	postmarked no later than the day before the election. An elector who is recorded as returning	ng a
23	mail ballot may not be allowed to vote in person on the day of the election. An elector who is	<u>s</u>
24	recorded as receiving, but not returning, a mail ballot may vote in person on the day of the	
25	election but only after signing a sworn statement that the elector has not voted in the election	n by
26	mail.	
27	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 16.1-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code	is
28	created and enacted as follows:	
29	Delivering ballots - Authorization of agents to receive ballots. The county audit	<u>or</u>
30	shall personally deliver the ballot to each applicant or applicant's agent who returns a proper	<u>ly</u>
31	completed application form to the auditor by five p.m. on the day before the election. A pers	<u>on</u>

1	acting as an agent may not, at the time, be a candidate for any office to be voted upon by the
2	applicant. The agent shall sign the agent's name before receiving the ballot and deposit with
3	the auditor authorization in writing from the applicant to receive the ballot. If the applicant is
4	unable to sign the applicant's name, the applicant shall mark X on the written authorization in
5	the presence of a disinterested person. The disinterested person shall print the name of the
6	applicant below the X and shall sign the name of the disinterested person following the printed
7	name of the applicant with the notation "witness to the mark". A person may not receive
8	compensation, including money, goods, or services, for acting as an agent for an applicant, nor
9	may a person act as an agent for more than four applicants in any one election.
10	SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 16.1-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	created and enacted as follows:
12	Casting ballots by mail final. Once an elector has cast a ballot by mail according to
13	the provisions of this chapter, the voted ballot may not be returned to the elector for any
14	purpose. An elector may not vote again after casting a ballot by mail under the provisions of
15	this chapter.
16	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code
17	is amended and reenacted as follows:
18	16.1-11.1-06. Canvass of votes - Special election board. The county auditor shall
19	appoint a special election board for the purpose of counting mail ballots. The board may not
20	begin counting the ballots until six p.m. cast prior to the day of the election at the same hour the
21	polls open on the day of the election. The county auditor shall adopt procedures to ensure that
22	election results are not publicly disclosed until after all the polls close in the county on the day
23	of the election. A county conducting a mail ballot election constitutes one voting area, and
24	ballots need not be sorted according to precinct or ward unless necessary for the administration
25	of the election.
26	SECTION 8. A new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 28-32-01 of the 1997
27	Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
28	The secretary of state with respect to rules adopted for the conduct of special
29	statewide elections under section 2 of this Act.
