- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to reimbursement of landowners for damage caused by hunters; and to
- 3 amend and reenact section 20.1-02-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to duties of
- 4 the game and fish advisory board; and to provide a continuing appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 20.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 8 Road and trail damage fund Transfer Continuing appropriation. The road and
- 9 trail damage fund is a special account in the state treasury. The fund may be used only for
- 10 reimbursing landowners for damage caused by hunters to roads and trails that are not
- 11 maintained with public funds. The amount of one hundred thousand dollars must be transferred
- 12 biennially from the game and fish fund to the road and trail damage fund and is hereby
- 13 appropriated as a continuing appropriation for the purposes of this section. Landowners
- 14 experiencing damage caused by hunters to roads and trails may file a claim for reimbursement
- 15 with the board of county commissioners of the county in which the road or trail is located or with
- 16 the game and fish advisory board. Upon approval of the board of county commissioners or the
- 17 game and fish advisory board, the commissioner shall reimburse landowners for damage
- 18 caused by hunters to roads and trails on their land. Under this section, a landowner may
- 19 receive up to five hundred dollars for damage caused by hunters to roads and trails on that
- 20 person's land.
- 21 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-02-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 22 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 23 **20.1-02-25. Meetings and duties.** Each board member shall hold a public meeting at
- 24 least twice each fiscal year in the board member's respective district to make presentations and

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- 1 to determine the needs and the opinions of those interested in these activities. The board shall
- 2 meet at least twice each fiscal year. The board has the authority to advise the director
- 3 regarding any policy of hunting, fishing, and trapping regulations, and may make general
- 4 recommendations concerning the operation of the department and its programs that the director
- 5 may carry out, and shall approve damage claims made by landowners under section 1 of this
- 6 Act. The board shall forward copies of its recommendations to the governor. This section does
- 7 not limit or restrict the powers, duties, and authority of the governor in the issuance of orders
- 8 and proclamations as provided in chapter 20.1-08.
