BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-36-01 of the 1997 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-36-01. Teachers' certificates - Criteria to be established.

- The education standards and practices board shall determine the criteria for teacher certification for school terms beginning on or after July 1, 1995. The criteria shall must be based upon standards which include considerations of character, adequate educational preparation, and general fitness to teach in the public schools of this state. After holding a public hearing, the board shall issue adopt rules concerning the issuance of teachers' certificates, and certificates.
 Certificates must be issued by the board's office board in accordance with the rules.
- 2. However, The board may not require any teacher who has graduated from college in an accredited teacher education program on or before September 1, 1980, may not be required to earn any college credits in native American or other multicultural courses in order to be certified or recertified.
- 3. The board may not certify an individual to teach if the individual has been convicted of a felony by a court in this state or outside this state, unless the board receives confirmation from a court in this state or outside of this state that, for substantive legal reasons, the conviction has been overturned on appeal.

- Nothing in this section may be interpreted to affect the validity of life certificates in existence on July 1, 1973, nor does this section affect vocational education certificate qualifications as provided in chapter 15-20.1.
 - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-36-15 of the 1997 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 15-36-15. Revocation of teacher's certificates Grounds Effect. The Except as provided in section 3, the education standards and practices board or the administrator's professional practices board in the case of a school administrator may suspend for a period of time, or revoke and annul any teacher's or administrator's certificate granted in this state upon any or all of the following grounds:
 - For any cause which would have authorized or required the education standards
 and practices board to refuse to grant the certificate if the facts were known at the
 time when the certificate was granted.
 - 2. For incompetency, immorality, intemperance, or cruelty of the certificate holder.
 - 3. The certificate holder has been convicted or pled guilty or nolo contendere before a court of competent jurisdiction in this or any other state, or before any federal court, of an offense determined by the education standards and practices board or the administrator's professional practices board in the case of a school administrator to have a direct bearing upon a person's ability to serve the public as a teacher or administrator, or the education standards and practices board or the administrator's professional practices board determines, following conviction of any offense, that the person is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
 - 4. For the refusal by the certificate holder to perform the duties of a teacher or the general neglect of the work of the school.
 - 5. For the breach, by the certificate holder, of a contract with any school district.
 - 6. Serious violation or a series of violations of the professional codes and standards promulgated in accordance with law.
 - The revocation of a certificate shall terminate the employment of the certificate holder by the school in which the holder is employed when the certificate is revoked, but the holder must be paid to the time the notice of revocation is received. Appeals from any order of revocation may be taken to the district court of Burleigh County as provided by chapter 28-32.

1 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 15-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 created and enacted as follows: 3 Felony conviction - Revocation of teaching certificate - Reinstatement. 4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the education standards and practices 1. 5 board shall immediately revoke the teaching certificate of an individual upon 6 receiving confirmation from a court in this state or outside of this state that the 7 individual has been convicted of a felony. 8 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the administrator's professional 2. 9 practices board shall immediately revoke the teaching certificate of any 10 administrator upon receiving confirmation from a court in this state or outside of 11 this state that the administrator has been convicted of a felony. A certificate revoked under this section may be reinstated only upon confirmation 12 <u>3.</u>
