- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-47-33 of the North Dakota Century Code, or
- 2 in the alternative to amend and reenact section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to length of the school year.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1034 does not become effective, section
15-47-33 of the 1997 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and
reenacted as follows:

1 Consists of at least six hours of instruction time for high school students, b. 2 during which time the students are required to be in attendance for the 3 purpose of receiving curricular instruction. 4 Daily instruction time in excess of five hours and thirty minutes for elementary 3. 5 students and six hours for high school students may be aggregated, after a 6 weather-related closure, to make up for up to six hours of instruction time lost 7 during a school year because of a weather-related school closure, if the school's 8 calendar provides for instruction time that exceeds the minimum required hours of 9 instruction by at least fifteen minutes during each of the one hundred seventy-three 10 full days of instruction. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code as 16 created by House Bill No. 1034, as approved by the fifty-sixth legislative assembly, is amended 17 and reenacted as follows: 18 15.1-06-04. School calendar - Length. 19 During each school year, a school district shall provide for a school calendar of at 1. 20 least one hundred eighty days, apportioned as follows: 21 One hundred seventy-three full days of instruction; a. 22 b. Three holidays listed in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section 23 15.1-06-02 and selected by the school board in consultation with district 24 teachers: 25 Two days for the attendance of teachers at the North Dakota education C. 26 association instructional conference; and 27 d. Up to two full days during which parent-teacher conferences are held or which 28 are deemed by the school board to be compensatory time for parent-teacher 29 conferences held outside regular school hours.

30 2. A full day of instruction consists of:

1		a. At least five and one-half hours of instruction time for elementary students,
2		during which time the students are required to be in attendance for the

6		curricular instruction.
7	<u>3.</u>	Daily instruction time in excess of five hours and thirty minutes for elementary
8		students and six hours for high school students may be aggregated, after a
9		weather-related closure, to make up for up to six hours of instruction time lost
10		during a school year because of a weather-related school closure, if the school's
11		calendar provides for instruction time that exceeds the minimum required hours of
12		instruction by at least fifteen minutes during each of the one hundred seventy-three
