1 A BILL for an Act relating to review of state agency applications for grants from the United

2 States government or foundations.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. Definitions.** In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:

- Application" includes any request for receipt of a grant, but does not include
 inquiries concerning the availability of grants or any terms of a grant.
- 7 2. "Foundation" includes any person that may provide a grant other than a state
 8 agency or the United States government.
- 9 3. "Grant" includes any conveyance of money or property, including gifts and
- 10 donations, which is not required to be repaid or which is not paid with full and
- 11 valuable consideration from the state agency or agencies receiving the grant and
- 12 which must be requested or applied for from the United States government or a
- foundation. The term does not include the normal operations of any statutory
 program, nor any grant that has been approved or appropriated by the legislative
- 15 assembly.

16 4. "State agency" includes any elected official or other entity of the state.

SECTION 2. Applications for grants must be provided. Before a state agency may
 submit an application for a grant, the state agency must submit the application to the office of
 intergovernmental assistance. The state agency may also submit any other pertinent
 information.

SECTION 3. Review process. The office of intergovernmental assistance shall review
 the application, consult with the applying state agency, and issue a report regarding the
 application.

1	SECTION 4. Contents of report. The report of the office of intergovernmental	
2	assistance must include:	
3	1.	A summary of the grant and its purpose, including an analysis of how the grant will
4		support existing state planning and policies;
5	2.	Any conditions, terms, or requirements of the grant;
6	3.	The amount of new funds to be obtained from the grant and the amount, if any, of
7		state funds required to fulfill any condition of the grant;
8	4.	The number of new employees needed to fulfill any duties or responsibilities
9		created if the grant is received, and an explanation concerning plans to reduce or
10		eliminate any positions created at the end of the grant;
11	5.	The effects of the grant on other state agencies or political subdivisions;
12	6.	Whether the grant is duplicative of programs, policies, or other grants already
13		existing or which may be applied for by other state agencies or political
14		subdivisions;
15	7.	The effects of the grant on individuals and private businesses or entities, including
16		any comments received concerning the grant;
17	8.	Whether any state laws, rules, or contracts must be superseded, modified,
18		suspended, waived, or amended to obtain the grant or to fulfill the terms of the
19		grant;
20	9.	The reputation, policies, and goals of any foundation involved with the grant;
21	10.	Whether the legislative assembly has indicated an intent to reject the moneys or
22		the program fostered by the grant; and
23	11.	Any other relevant or pertinent considerations.
24	SECTION 5. Consideration of application. The office of intergovernmental	
25	assistance shall approve or reject the application within thirty days after receiving the	
26	application. The state agency may not submit the application to the United States government	
27	or the foundation if the office of intergovernmental assistance does not approve the application.	
28	SECTION 6. Effect of approval. Approval to submit an application under this Act does	
29	not bind the emergency commission or the budget section of the legislative council in exercising	
30	responsibili	ties under chapter 54-16.

- 1 SECTION 7. Effect of rejection. Rejection of a state agency's request to submit an
- 2 application does not prevent that state agency from seeking legislative approval or an
- 3 appropriation concerning the grant application.
