1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the children's

2 services coordinating committee; and to provide a statement of legislative intent.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 5 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from special funds derived from federal 6 funds and other income to the children's services coordinating committee for the purpose of 7 defraying the expenses of its various divisions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and 8 ending June 30, 2001, as follows: 9 Salaries and wages \$70,784 10 **Operating expenses** 120,313 11 Grants 6,562,500

12 Total all funds \$6,753,597

13 SECTION 2. GRANTS - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL. Of the \$6,562,500 14 appropriated in the grants line item in section 1 of this Act, the children's services coordinating 15 committee shall provide grants of \$200,000 to the partnership project that is providing services 16 to children with serious emotional disorders in human service region number seven (Bismarck), 17 \$200,000 to the native American alcohol and drug abuse education program, and \$50,000 to 18 the sacred child project during the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001. 19 Any other statewide grants distributed by the committee, unless specifically approved by the 20 legislative assembly, are subject to budget section approval. 21 SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL INCOME - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL. All

22 income of the children's services coordinating committee in excess of the estimated income line 23 item appropriated in section 1 of this Act is hereby appropriated to the children's services

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1	coordinating committee for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001,		
2	and may be spent only upon authorization of the emergency commission.		
3	SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FUNCTION OF REGIONAL AND TRIBAL		
4	CHILDREN'S SERVICES COORDINATING COMMITTE	ES. It is the intent of the legislative	
5	assembly that each regional and tribal children's services coordinating committee function as a		
6	regional planning committee to monitor and coordinate children's services in each region and		
7	that the regional and tribal children's services coordinating committees not directly provide		
8	services or programs.		
9	SECTION 5. FEDERAL FUND ALLOCATIONS - EMERGENCY COMMISSION		
10	APPROVAL. Of the \$7,500,000 of federal funds estimated to be generated as a result of		
11	participating entities claiming federal administrative cost reimbursements through the		
12	department of human services, the following allocations are made for the biennium beginning		
13	July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001:

26	If less than \$7,500,000 is generated as a result of participating entities claiming federal		
27	administrative cost reimbursements for the 1999-2001 biennium, the children's services		
28	coordinating committee shall proportionately reduce the percentage allocations for statewide		
29	grants and regional and tribal children's services coordinating committee grants to generate the		
30	funds necessary to provide a total of \$1,500,000 for the 1999-2001 biennium for grants to		
31	regional and tribal committees for administrative costs under this section. Any federal funds		

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- 1 received by the state as a result of participating entities claiming federal administrative cost
- 2 reimbursements through the department of human services in excess of \$7,500,000 for the
- 3 biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001, must be distributed, subject to
- 4 emergency commission approval as follows:
