1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-40.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to foundation aid payments for elementary summer school programs; and to provide an

3 appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-40.1-08 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
6 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15-40.1-08. Elementary per student payments - Amount. Payments must be made
8 from state funds to each school district operating an elementary school and to each school
9 district contracting to educate elementary students in a federal school, employing teachers
10 holding valid certificates or permits in accordance with section 15-47-46 and chapter 15-36,
11 adjusted as provided in section 15-40.1-09, as follows:

12 For each one-room rural school, the amount of money resulting from multiplying 1. 13 the factor 1.28 adjusted by sixty-five percent of the difference between 1.28 and 14 the factor representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this 15 category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, times the 16 number of students in that school in grades one through eight in average daily 17 membership, up to a maximum of sixteen students, times the educational support per student provided in section 15-40.1-06. There must be paid .9 times each 18 19 additional student in its school in grades one through eight in average daily 20 membership times the educational support per student provided in section 21 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made for more than twenty students in 22 average daily membership. If the one-room rural school is located in a school 23 district with another elementary school, the weighting factor for the students in 24 grades one through six must be based on the average daily membership in the

1district in grades one through six as provided in subsections 2 through 4. If the2one-room rural school is located in a school district with another school that has3students in grade seven or eight, the weighting factor for the students in grade4seven or eight must be the same as that provided for in subsection 5. Beginning5July 1, 1998, the factor is 1.28 adjusted by seventy-five percent of the difference6between 1.28 and the five-year average cost of education per student for this7category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction.

8 2. For each elementary school in school districts having under one hundred students 9 in average daily membership in grades one through six, the amount of money 10 resulting from multiplying the factor 1.09 adjusted by sixty-five percent of the 11 difference between 1.09 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of 12 education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of 13 public instruction, times the number of students in that school in grades one 14 through six in average daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher, 15 times the educational support per student provided in section 15-40.1-06, except 16 that no payment may be made for more than twenty-five students in average daily 17 membership in each classroom or for each teacher. Beginning July 1, 1998, the 18 factor is 1.09 adjusted by seventy-five percent of the difference between 1.09 and 19 the five-year average cost of education per student for this category, as determined 20 by the superintendent of public instruction.

21 3. For each elementary school in school districts having one hundred or more 22 students in average daily membership in grades one through six, and provided the 23 districts in which such schools are located have an average daily membership of 24 less than one thousand elementary students in grades one through six, the amount 25 of money resulting from multiplying the factor .905 adjusted by sixty-five percent of 26 the difference between .905 and the factor representing the five-year average cost 27 of education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of 28 public instruction, times the number of students in that school in grades one 29 through six in average daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher 30 times the educational support per student provided in section 15-40.1-06, except 31 that no payment may be made for more than thirty students in average daily

- membership in each classroom or for each teacher. Beginning July 1, 1998, the
 factor is .905 adjusted by seventy-five percent of the difference between .905 and
 the five-year average cost of education per student for this category, as determined
 by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 5 For each elementary school in school districts having an average daily 4. 6 membership of one thousand or more elementary students in grades one through 7 six, the amount of money resulting from multiplying the factor .95 adjusted by 8 sixty-five percent of the difference between .95 and the factor representing the 9 five-year average cost of education per student for this category, as determined by 10 the superintendent of public instruction, times the number of students in that school 11 in grades one through six in average daily membership in each classroom or for 12 each teacher times the educational support per student provided in section 13 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made for more than thirty students in 14 average daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher. Beginning 15 July 1, 1998, the factor is .95 adjusted by seventy-five percent of the difference 16 between .95 and the five-year average cost of education per student for this 17 category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 18 5. For each of the above classes of elementary schools, except for one-room rural 19 schools that are not located in a district with another school having students in 20 grade seven or eight, there must be paid to each school the amount of money 21 resulting from multiplying the factor 1.01 adjusted by sixty-five percent of the 22 difference between 1.01 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of 23 education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of 24 public instruction, times the number of students in that school in grades seven and 25 eight in average daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher times the 26 educational support per student provided in section 15-40.1-06, except that no 27 payment may be made for more than thirty students in average daily membership 28 in each classroom or for each teacher. Beginning July 1, 1998, the factor is 1.01 29 adjusted by seventy-five percent of the difference between 1.01 and the five-year 30 average cost of education per student for this category, as determined by the 31 superintendent of public instruction.

1 For each elementary school having students under the compulsory age for school 6. 2 attendance, but not less than three years of age, in a special education program 3 approved by the director of special education, the amount of money resulting from 4 multiplying the factor 1.01 adjusted by sixty-five percent of the difference between 5 1.01 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education per 6 student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, 7 times the number of special education students in that school under the 8 compulsory age for school attendance in average daily membership in each 9 classroom or for each teacher times the educational support per student provided 10 in section 15-40.1-06. Beginning July 1, 1998, the factor is 1.01 adjusted by 11 seventy-five percent of the difference between 1.01 and the five-year average cost 12 of education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of 13 public instruction.

14 For each elementary school providing a kindergarten that is established according 7. 15 to provisions of section 15-45-01, the amount of money resulting from multiplying 16 the factor .50 adjusted by sixty-five percent of the difference between .50 and the 17 factor representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this 18 category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, times the 19 number of students in that school in average daily membership in each classroom 20 or for each teacher times the educational support per student, as provided under 21 section 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made for more than 22 twenty-five students in average daily membership in each classroom or for each 23 teacher. The full per student payment may be made only to those kindergarten 24 programs providing the equivalent of ninety full days of classroom instruction 25 during any twelve-month period. Programs providing shorter periods of instruction 26 during the same time period must receive a proportionately smaller per student 27 payment. Beginning July 1, 1998, the factor is .50 adjusted by seventy-five percent 28 of the difference between .50 and the five-year average cost of education per 29 student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction. 30 The superintendent of public instruction shall make proportionate payments to each 31 public school district educating students who are also enrolled in nonpublic schools.

- 1 Every school district must receive at least as much in total payments for elementary
- 2 students as it would have received if it had the highest number of students in the next lower
- 3 category.
- 4 The superintendent may adopt rules regarding eligibility for school districts to receive
- 5 proportionate payments for summer education programs. The proportionate payment made
- 6 under this section during the biennium for elementary summer school programs may not
- 7 exceed one-half of one percent of the total amount appropriated by the legislative assembly for
- 8 <u>foundation aid and transportation aid during the biennium.</u>
