5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-06.2-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is

## 50-06.2-03. Powers and duties of the state agency.

- 8 <u>1.</u> The state agency has the following powers or duties under this chapter:
  9 <u>4.</u> <u>a.</u> To act as the official agency of the state in the administration of the human services programs for individuals and families in conformity with state and federal requirements-;
- 12 <u>2.</u> <u>b.</u> To prepare, at least biennially, a comprehensive human services plan which

- 14a. (1)Include human services determined essential in effectuating the15purposes of this chapter-; and

16b. (2)Detail the human services identified by the state agency for provision by17human service centers and the services which the county agencies18have agreed to make available in approved county plans as a condition19for the receipt of any funds allocated or distributed by the state agency-;

203.c.To make available, through county agencies or human service centers, any or21all of the services set out in the comprehensive human services plan on22behalf of those individuals and families determined to be eligible for those23services under criteria established by the state agency-:
