

**SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4036**

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the operation of the temporary  
2 assistance for needy families program in North Dakota as it relates to the relationship between  
3 the state and the federally recognized Indian tribes in the state.

4 **WHEREAS**, the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of  
5 1996 provides the state of North Dakota with an annual temporary assistance for needy families  
6 block grant to assist needy families so that children may be cared for in their own homes or in  
7 the homes of relatives; and

8 **WHEREAS**, the temporary assistance for needy families block grant allows states some  
9 flexibility in the design of the program; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the temporary assistance for needy families block grant requires recipients  
11 of assistance to meet certain work requirements and limits the number of months an adult may  
12 receive such assistance; and

13 **WHEREAS**, an increasing percent of the recipients of assistance under the temporary  
14 assistance for needy families block grant in North Dakota are members of a federally  
15 recognized Indian tribe; and

16 **WHEREAS**, a large portion of these individuals resides on Indian reservations within the  
17 state; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the Indian reservations are located in the rural areas of the state and are  
19 economically depressed; and

20 **WHEREAS**, the effective coordination and cooperation between the state, tribes, and  
21 local governments are critical to the success of the welfare programs;

22 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE**  
23 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

1           That the Legislative Council study the operation of the temporary assistance for needy  
2 families program in North Dakota as it relates to the relationship between the state and the  
3 federally recognized Indian tribes in the state; and

4           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council, in conducting its study,  
5 evaluate the impact of the temporary assistance for needy families program on the federally  
6 recognized Indian tribes within the state; and

7           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council review the process through  
8 which the Department of Human Services receives input from local governments and the  
9 federally recognized Indian tribes within the state; and

10          **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council consider the impact of tribal  
11 sovereignty on economic development and the implementation of the temporary assistance for  
12 needy families program in areas under the jurisdiction of federally recognized Indian tribes  
13 within the state; and

14          **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council report its findings and  
15 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to  
16 the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly.
