- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision e of subsection 3 of section 54-52-17,
- 2 subdivision b of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17, subsection 9 of section 54-52-17, and section
- 3 54-52-17.11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disability retirement, normal
- 4 retirement benefits, retirement benefit options, and postretirement adjustments for supreme and
- 5 district court judges under the public employees retirement system; and to repeal section
- 6 54-52-17.12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to postretirement adjustments for
- 7 supreme and district court judges under the public employees retirement system.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision e of subsection 3 of section 54-52-17 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- e. Disability retirement date is the first day of the month after a member becomes permanently and totally disabled, according to medical evidence called for under the rules of the board, and has completed at least one hundred eighty days of eligible employment. For supreme and district court judges, permanent and total disability is based solely on a judge's inability to perform judicial duties arising out of physical or mental impairment, as determined pursuant to rules adopted by the board or as provided by subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 27-23-03. A member is eligible to receive disability retirement benefits only if the member:
 - (1) Became disabled during the period of eligible employment; and
 - (2) Applies for disability retirement benefits within twelve months of the date the member terminates employment.

A member is eligible to continue to receive disability benefits as long as the permanent and total disability continues and the member submits the

1 necessary documentation and undergoes medical testing required by the 2 board, or for as long as the member participates in a rehabilitation program 3 required by the board, or both. If the board determines that a member no 4 longer meets the eligibility definition, the board may discontinue the disability 5 retirement benefit. The board is authorized to may pay the cost of any 6 medical testing or rehabilitation services it deems necessary and these 7 payments are hereby appropriated from the retirement fund for those 8 purposes. 9 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision b of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 of the 10 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 b. Single life Normal retirement benefits for all supreme and district court judges 12 under the public employees retirement system reaching normal retirement 13 date equal an annual amount, payable monthly, comprised of a benefit as 14 defined in this chapter, which must be determined as follows: 15 (1) Benefits must be calculated from the time of appointment or election to 16 the bench and must equal three and one-half percent of final average 17 salary multiplied by the first ten years of judicial service, two and eighty 18 hundredths percent of final average salary multiplied by the second ten 19 years of judicial service, and one and one-fourth percent of final 20 average salary multiplied by the number of years of judicial service 21 exceeding twenty years. 22 (2) Service benefits must include, in addition, an amount equal to the 23 percent specified in subdivision a of final average salary multiplied by 24 the number of years of nonjudicial employee service and employment. 25 (3) A participant who retired before August 1, 1995, is entitled to benefits 26 calculated at two and eighty hundredths percent multiplied by the 27 second ten years of judicial service, with the increased benefits payable 28 beginning August 1, 1995. 29 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 9 of section 54-52-17 of the 1999 Supplement 30 to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1 The board shall promulgate regulations adopt rules providing for the receipt of 2 retirement benefits in the following optional forms: 3 a. Joint Single life. 4 An actuarially equivalent joint and survivor option, with fifty percent or one b. 5 hundred percent options. 6 b. с. Level An actuarially equivalent level social security option, which shall be is 7 available only to early retirees members who retire prior to attaining the age 8 at which they may begin to receive unreduced social security benefits. 9 Life with five-year or ten-year certain options. c. d. 10 Unless Except for supreme and district court judges, unless a member specifically 11 requests that the member receive benefits according to one of these options at the 12 time of applying for retirement, all retirement benefits must be in the form of a 13 single life benefit. For supreme and district court judges, unless a member 14 specifically requests that the member receive benefits according to one of these options at the time of applying for retirement, all retirement benefits must be in the 15 form of a lifetime monthly pension with fifty percent of the benefit continuing for the 16 17 life of the surviving spouse, if any. 18 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-52-17.11 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 19 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 20 **54-52-17.11.** Judges postretirement adjustments. A supreme or district court judge 21 or that person's beneficiary who, on December 31, 1997 2001, is receiving retirement benefits 22 under subdivision b of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 is entitled to receive an increase in 23 benefits equal to two percent of the individual's present benefits with the increase payable 24 beginning January 1, 1998 2002. A supreme or district court judge or that person's beneficiary 25 who, on December 31, 1998 2002, is receiving retirement benefits under subdivision b of 26 subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 is entitled to receive an increase in benefits equal to two 27 percent of the individual's present benefits with the increase payable beginning January 1, 1999 28 2003. 29 SECTION 5. REPEAL. Section 54-52-17.12 of the North Dakota Century Code is 30 repealed.
