1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 4-35 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to creation of a crop protection product harmonization and registration

3 board; to amend and reenact sections 4-35-06.2 and 4-35-06.3 of the North Dakota Century

4 Code, relating to funds received for expenses paid relating to the registration of pesticides and

5 the minor use pesticide fund; to repeal section 11 of chapter 31 of the 1999 Session Laws,

6 relating to the crop harmonization committee; and to provide an appropriation.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-06.2 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
9 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

10 4-35-06.2. Commissioner of agriculture - Pesticide control Crop protection

11 product harmonization and registration board - Recovery of funds. The commissioner of 12 agriculture crop protection product harmonization and registration board may accept, on behalf 13 of the pesticide control board, funds received for expenses paid by the pesticide control board 14 relating to the registration of pesticides or donations offered to or for the benefit of the pesticide 15 control board. All moneys received under this section must be deposited in the minor use 16 pesticide fund to pay expenses relating to the registration of pesticides or for the specific 17 purpose for which they are given. The pesticide control board shall attempt, whenever 18 possible, to recover funds expended relating to the registration of pesticides and shall adopt 19 rules to administer provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-06.3 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-35-06.3. Minor use pesticide fund - Continuing appropriation. The minor use
pesticide fund is created as a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys in the fund are
appropriated on a continuing basis to the pesticide control crop protection product

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- 1 <u>harmonization and registration</u> board for the purpose of conducting or commissioning studies,
- 2 investigations, and evaluations regarding the registration and use of pesticides for minor crops,
- 3 minor uses, and other uses as determined by the board.
- SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 4-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>1.</u> <u>The crop protection product harmonization and registration board consists of the</u>
 8 governor or the governor's designee, the agriculture commissioner, the chairman

- 9 of the house agriculture committee, the chairman of the senate agriculture
- 10 <u>committee, one crop protection product manufacturing industry representative</u>
- 11 appointed by the chairman of the legislative council, and two consumers of crop
- protection products appointed by the governor. The governor or the governor's
 designee shall serve as chairman of the board. The board shall:
- 14 <u>a.</u> Identify and prioritize crop protection product labeling needs;
- 15b.Explore the extent of authority given to this state under the federal Insecticide,16Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act [7 U.S.C. 136a];
- 17c.Identify the data necessary to enable registration of a use to occur in a timely18manner;
- 19d.Determine what research, if any, is necessary to fulfill data requirements for20activities listed in this section;
- 21e.Request the agriculture commissioner to pursue specific research funding22options from public and private sources;
- 23f.Request the North Dakota state university agricultural experiment station to24pursue specific research to coordinate registration efforts; and
- 25g.Pursue any opportunities to make more crop protection product options26available to agricultural producers in this state through any means the board27determines advisable.
- 28 2. The board may contract with a consultant to conduct studies or provide research or
 29 information regarding crop protection product registration and labeling needs.
- 30 <u>3.</u> The board may administer a grant program through which agriculture commodity
 31 groups established under this title may apply for funds to be used by the groups to

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1		address issues related to the registration of crop protection products. To be
2		eligible for receipt of a grant, an applicant must submit an application to the board
3		which requests a specific amount of funds, specifies the exact purposes for which
4		the grant would be used, and provides a detailed timetable for the use of the grant
5		funds. The board may impose any additional conditions it determines appropriate
6		for grant recipients, including requiring periodic reports and furnishing of matching
7		funds. The board may terminate funding of a previously approved grant at any
8		time if the board is dissatisfied with the performance of the grant recipient.
9	<u>4.</u>	The board may use not more than fifteen percent of the funds under its supervision
10		for administrative purposes, including the cost of contracting for administrative
11		services and reimbursement of board member expenses. The members of the
12		board who are members of the legislative assembly are entitled to compensation
13		from the legislative council for attendance at board meetings at the rate provided
14		for members of the legislative assembly for attendance at interim committee
15		meetings and are entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending the
16		meetings in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
17	<u>5.</u>	The board may adopt rules to implement this section.
18	SECTION 4. REPEAL. Section 11 of chapter 31 of the 1999 Session Laws is	
19	repealed.	
20	SEC	CTION 5. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
21	environment and rangeland protection fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated,	
22	the sum of \$325,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from special funds	
23	derived from grants or donation income, the sum of \$200,000, or so much of the sum as may	
24	be necessary, to the crop protection product harmonization and registration board for the	
25	purposes of addressing crop protection product registration and labeling needs and providing	
26	grants as provided in section 3 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending	
27	June 30, 20	003.
