- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-36-11, 15-36-11.1, 15-36-11.2, and
- 2 15-36-11.3 of the North Dakota Century Code or in the alternative to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 15.1-13-17, 15.1-13-20, and 15.1-13-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 4 teacher licensure.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, section
 15-36-11 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and
- 8 reenacted as follows:
- 9 **15-36-11. License required.** Except as provided by section 15-36-11.1, an An
- 10 individual must hold a valid North Dakota professional teaching license be licensed to teach by
- 11 the education standards and practices board or approved to teach by the education standards
- 12 <u>and practices board</u> in order to be permitted or employed to teach in any public school in this
- 13 state.

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- 14 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, section
- 15 15-36-11.1 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and
- 16 reenacted as follows:
- 17 15-36-11.1. Exception to certificate requirement Approval to teach Rules.
- 18 <u>1.</u> An The board shall approve an individual without a valid certificate who is teaching
- 19 under contract with a school may teach and be employed to teach if approved by
- 20 the to teach if the individual is licensed to teach in Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska,
- 21 South Dakota, or Wyoming and if no complaint is pending against the individual
- with the teacher licensing entity of the state in which the individual is licensed.
- 23 2. The education standards and practices board. The education standards and
- 24 practices board shall establish by rule the terms and conditions of approval. The

terms and conditions may include payment of fines to the board, enrollment in and completion of continuing education courses, and a deadline for filing a completed application. Approval to teach and be employed to teach without a valid North Dakota certificate may only be granted may approve an individual to teach if the individual has previously held a valid North Dakota certificate, currently or license, holds a valid teaching certificate or license in another jurisdiction issued by any state other than those listed in subsection 1, or has filed a completed application for licensure with the board. The board shall adopt rules establishing the terms and conditions under which an individual may be approved to teach under this subsection. The terms and conditions may include the payment of a fine to the board, enrollment in and completion of continuing education courses, and submission of a completed application for licensure by a date certain.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15-36-11.2 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-36-11.2. Interim reciprocal teaching certificate license - Period of validity.

The education standards and practices board shall grant an interim reciprocal teaching eertificate license in accordance with sections 15-47-46 and 15-41-25 to an individual who holds a valid regular teaching license or certificate from another a state other than Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, or Wyoming, provided:
 - a. The <u>individual's licensure or</u> certification is based upon a minimum of a bachelor's degree with a major that meets the issuing state's requirements in elementary education, middle-level education, or a content area taught in at a public high school:
 - The <u>individual's licensure or</u> certification requires the completion of a
 professional education sequence from a state-approved teacher education
 program, including supervised student teaching;
 - c. The individual submits to a background check as required of initial applicants in by section 15-38-18.2;
 - d. The background check reveals nothing for which a North Dakota applicant would be denied initial certification licensure; and

An interim reciprocal eertificate license granted under this section is valid for two 4 years. 5 The individual shall submit evidence of progress on the individual's educational 6 plan required by subsection 1 to the education standards and practices board at 7 the end of the two-year period. AMENDMENT. Section 15-36-11.3 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 16 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 17 15-36-11.3. Reciprocal acceptance of teaching certificates - Report or licenses. 18 On or before July 1, 2001, the education standards and practices board shall pursue the 19 reciprocal acceptance of teaching certificates or licenses issued by other states. The 20 education standards and practices board shall present a progress report regarding 21 implementation of the program to the legislative council or to a committee designated by the 22 council before October 1, 2000 other than Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, or 23 Wyoming. 24 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-17 of the North Dakota Century Code as 25 created by House Bill No. 1045, as approved by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly, is 26 amended and reenacted as follows: 27 15.1-13-17. Teaching license - Requirements - Exceptions. 28 An individual may not engage in the profession of teaching unless: 29 a. The individual holds a teaching license issued by the board; or 30 b. The individual is approved to teach by the board.

The board shall approve an individual to teach if the individual is licensed to teach 2 in Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, or Wyoming and if no complaint 3 is pending against the individual with the teacher licensing entity of the state in 4 which the individual is licensed. 5 An individual may be approved to teach by the board only if the individual has 6 previously held a North Dakota teaching certificate or license, holds a teaching 7 certificate or license issued by another any state other than those listed in 8 subsection 2, or has filed a completed application for licensure with the board. 9 The board shall adopt rules establishing the terms and conditions under which an 10 individual may be approved to teach, as provided for in this section under this 11 subsection. The terms and conditions may include the payment of a fine to the 12 board, enrollment in and completion of continuing education courses, and 13 submission of a completed application for licensure by a date certain. 14 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-20 of the North Dakota Century Code as created by House Bill No. 1045, as approved by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly, is 15 16 amended and reenacted as follows: 17 15.1-13-20. Interim reciprocal teaching license - Period of validity. 18
 - The board shall grant an interim reciprocal teaching license in accordance with sections 15.1-18-02 and 15.1-18-03 to an individual who holds a regular teaching license or certificate from another a state other than Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, or Wyoming, provided:

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- a. The individual's licensure or certification is based upon a minimum of a bachelor's degree with a major that meets the issuing state's requirements in elementary education, middle-level education, or a content area taught at a public high school;
- The individual's licensure or certification is based upon the completion of a professional education sequence from a state-approved teacher education program and includes supervised student teaching;
- The individual submits to a background check as required of initial applicants by this chapter;

The background check reveals nothing for which a North Dakota applicant 2 would be denied initial licensure; and 3 The individual submits a plan for meeting all requirements necessary to e. 4 become a licensed teacher in this state. 5 2. An interim reciprocal license granted under this section is valid for two years. 6 3. The individual shall submit evidence of progress on the plan required by 7 subsection 1 to the board prior to before renewal of the interim reciprocal license. 8 4. The board may renew the interim reciprocal license for one additional two-year 9 period if the board finds that the individual has demonstrated satisfactory progress. 10 5. Notwithstanding any other law, an interim reciprocal license granted under this 11 section is the equivalent of a teaching license granted under this chapter. 12 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-21 of the North Dakota Century Code as 13 created by House Bill No. 1045, as approved by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly, is 14 amended and reenacted as follows: 15 15.1-13-21. Reciprocal acceptance of teaching licenses or certificates. The board 16 shall pursue the reciprocal acceptance of teaching licenses or certificates issued by other 17 states other than Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, or Wyoming.
