- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a study of nursing needs; and to provide an expiration date.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. Nursing needs study. The board may address issues of supply and demand for nurses, including issues of recruitment, retention, and utilization of nurses. The board:
  - May develop a strategic statewide plan to alleviate the nursing shortage in the state by establishing and maintaining a data base on nursing supply and demand in the state, including current supply and demand and future projections, and by selecting priorities from the plan to be addressed.
  - 2. May convene various groups representative of nurses, other health care providers, business and industry, consumers, legislators, and educators to review and comment on data analysis prepared for the board; recommend systematic changes, including strategies for implementation of recommended changes; and evaluate and report the results of these efforts to the legislative assembly and the public.
  - 3. May review and study the nursing educational requirements in this state.
  - May study the nursing shortage in this state and the implications for rural communities.
    - 5. May increase any license or registration fees imposed by the board up to fifteen dollars to reimburse the board for actual expenses incurred under this section.
  - 6. Shall report annually on the progress of the study, if undertaken, to the legislative council and shall provide a final report to the sixtieth legislative assembly.
